RAB meeting scheduled



ATC hosts Technology Media Day

The transitioning Army environment, along with evolving battlefield requirements, has prompted decision makers to take a closer look at current innovations that may be available down the road to enhance the efficiency of Army assets.

As a result, the U.S. Army Aberdeen Test Center hosted a Tactical Wheeled Vehicle Platform Systems Demonstration, or PSD, the week of Aug. 14, inviting more than 20 contractors to present equipment and vehicles equipped with upgraded technology to meet today's requirements as well as tomorrow's.

Col. John Myers, project manager, Future Tactical Systems, Program Executive Office for Combat Support and Combat Systems Support; John Wehrli, chief, TACOM Mobility Division; and a team of ATC employees led the event.

Myers said that the Army is actively engaging in a strategy to modernize and eventually replace existing light, medium and heavy tactical wheeled vehicles with more capable

vehicles with enhanced technologies to better face challenges involving the War on Terror.

"The Army has defined

requirements for the future as far as the use of wheeled vehicles in combat zones," Myers said. "And now they want to see what capabilities are avail-

able to meet those requirements. We asked these vendors to participate to show us what they can provide now and what we can expect them

to provide in the future."

Wehrli, whose job it is to write the requirements for future Army vehicles, said

APG and Harford County Fire Department reaffirms Mutual Aid Agreement

The U.S. Army Garrison Aberdeen Proving Ground Fire and Emergency Services Division of the Directorate of Safety, Health and Environment and the Harford County Fire Department reaffirmed their Mutual Aid Agreement Aug. 17 at the APG Emergency Services Center.

The agreement is for both fire departments to provide mutual aid in fire protection, fire fighting and emergency services including basic medical support, basic advanced life support and hazardous material containment and confinement.

Col. John T. Wright, deputy installation commander, and Tom Schaech, president of Harford County Volunteer Fire and Ambulance Association, signed the agreement.

"[The agreement] is a continued opportunity to show and share the fire department with the

county," Wright said. "It's important because [the APG Fire Department] is the only full-time fire department in the county."

"We appreciate your service," Schaech said. APG and Harford County fire departments have had this agreement for decades, according to Chief Edward Budnick of the APG Fire Department.

"We're just updating it because the Army came up with a few new rules for jurisdictions, and it was a good time to look at the agreement," Budnick said.

"It's an 'I'll scratch your back if you scratch mine' relationship," he said.

Budnick said the new rules under the agreement include "additional support of emergency medical responses, Hazmat or weapons of mass destruction responses."

Schaech gave his perspective on the agreement. "We don't even consider a line between the jurisdictions," he said. "It's a close, working agreement and we help each other every day."

SJA defines role of legal office

A new staff judge advocate arrived in Aberdeen Proving Ground in June.

Lt. Col. Don F. Pollack comes to APG after serving as a prosecutor with the Office of Military Commissions, Office of the Secretary of Defense, responsible for preparing cases for trial against members of Al Qaeda.

As the SJA, Pollack serves as legal advisor and action officer to Maj. Gen. Roger A. Nadeau, commander of APG and the U.S. Army Research, Development and Engineering Command and Garrison Commander Col. John T. Wright.

Mindful of that, Pollack said that his main focus is managing the legal services that are provided to the community.

"My job is to clear away any problems that prevent our people from doing their jobs and to make sure they have the resources they need," Pollack said.

He said that the legal office is in "great shape," and that although there may be minor adjustments as occurs with any change in leadership, the overall mission and goals remain unchanged.

"My main goal right now is to allow them to do their jobs," Pollack said of his legal staff.

"Our focus is the installation focus," he said. "We don't create work; we assist and support."

Pollack described himself as "more of a director than a commander" and as one who is "always looking to improve what needs to be improved."

He said that he is happy with APG and the surrounding area and with the personnel in place who support the SJA mission.

"The staff is great," he said. "I came into a great office with good people who know how to do their jobs."

A native of New York, Pollack was commissioned in 1989 after graduating from William and Mary Law School with a Jurist Doctorate. He also holds a bachelor's in English and economics from the University of Virginia.

His military education includes the Judge Advocate Basic Course, Judge Advocate Graduate Course and Command and General Staff College.

His past assignments include serving as chief, Administrative and Civil Law Division, Multi-National Force-Iraq where he was responsible for advising the commander, Gen. George Casey and his staff on legal matters including fiscal law. Also, he served as a trial attorney with the Environmental Law Division, U.S. Army Legal Services Agency; Washington, D.C.; as senior defense counsel for the Military District of Washington; chief of Justice, I Corps and Fort Lewis; chief of Justice, Joint Readiness Training Center and Fort Polk; appellate attorney, Defense Appellate Division, U.S. Army Legal Services Agency; Washington, D.C.; command judge advocate, 23rd Support Group Camp Humphreys, Korea; and as trial counsel, 21st Theater Army Command, Karlsruhe, Germany.

He was deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

APG trial defense team serves APG Soldiers

A legal team on Aberdeen Proving Ground provides military defense counseling and representation to the installation's Soldiers as well as to active, National Guard and Reserve Soldiers serving on active duty, within Region I.

This includes Virginia, Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York including the 1st Recruiting Command.

This large responsibility is handled by the two-person team of Maj. Tom Barnard, defense counsel, and legal assistant Pamela Taylor, an Army veteran and military spouse who screens each client before determining their needs.

"She is the face of the Trial Defense Service office," Barnard said, "and someone who is totally familiar with the military legal system."

Barnard said he talks to commanders often, discussing Soldier issues and coming up with solutions to keep good Soldiers in the Army.

"Our goal is to ensure Soldier's rights are protected," he said. "If a Soldier commits an offense, then the best philosophy is to look at the whole Soldier as well as the offense, then, ask how the Army can keep this Soldier from making the same mistake. Not everyone

realizes what it costs to train one Soldier. If it's possible to keep a Soldier in and continue to serve, while maintaining the readiness, morale and discipline of the unit, then the Army should do so."

"That's the basis of Military Justice," Taylor added. "Correct infractions, educate, and reform Soldiers who have the potential for rehabilitation."

"Every case has to be individually evaluated using the total Soldier concept," Barnard added. Trial Defense provides Soldiers with legal advice on rights advisement and all non-judicial and judicial actions from minor offenses under Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, to General Courts Martial.

The Trial Defense Service office is located in building 310, on the first floor, wing 2, room 9. Use the separate entrance on the right side of the building.

Walk-in service for Article 15s and Administrative Separation actions is 8:40 to 11 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday. Appointments are scheduled as needed.

Soldiers who have been read their rights or are suspected of a crime should contact the Trial Defense Service office immediately to be advised.

ATTENTION ALL SOLDIERS

Soldiers charged and found guilty of a crime, could face confinement, loss of rank and discharge from the Army.

The APG Trial Defense Service office handles all types of military criminal matters, including felonies, misdemeanors and summary offenses against Soldiers.

Any Soldiers questioned by their chain of command or the police, advised of their rights or apprehended, should immediately request to speak to an attorney. With so much at stake, it is important to contact an attorney as soon as possible to protect a Soldier's rights and liberty.

Until given the opportunity to consult with an attorney, remember the "4 No's:"

NO

Waiver of rights.
Statements (oral or written).
Polygraphs.
Consent to be searched.

In addition, Main won 5th place in two categories. One of them was for the "Animal-Not Pet" class. The winning photo was of a turtle on





that the Army is looking for certain operational characteristics for its future fleets.

"We want to see how vendors can match up to those characteristics," he said.

John Wozniak, TACOM project manager, PSD, added that the event was an "education effort" not a selection process but an effort to identify capabilities that could answer current and future tactical wheeled vehicle capability gaps. He said the gathered information will be used to make the Army requirements and specification writers better.

"We are looking for realistic relationships regarding mobility, transportability and survivability," Wozniak said.

He said that the PSD was in a two-part phase; the first being the displays and the second being active testing of selected vehicles.

"We're impressed with the initiative these companies have taken," Wozniak said. "They are good companies reacting to the needs of customers, and that is to be applauded."

On behalf of the TACOM Commander Maj. Gen. William M. Lenaers, former chief of Ordnance, and the PM FTS, Wozniak thanked ATC and the APG Garrison for their support of the event.

"Support from APG has been phe-

nomenal," he said, noting that numerous Army branches, such as the Quartermaster, Aviation, Transportation and Ordnance Corps, as well as hundreds of civilians, Soldiers and Marines were involved in the production and testing process of the PSD.

"APG organizations have bent over backwards to meet or exceed our needs with a total 'can do' attitude," he added. "They've been a pleasure to work with."

The Tactical Wheeled Vehicle Strategy aims to support and improve the tactical wheeled vehicle fleet for the future. The PSD is part of the strategy and one of several activities that will lead to developing and refining realistic requirements for improved current and future tactical vehicles.

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
Young aviator 'wannabe' receives wings as gift



ECBC pioneering effort to change school curriculum

Joppatowne High pilots courses in homeland security, emergency preparedness

The Edgewood Chemical Biological Center is working with Harford County Public Schools to develop a new curriculum in Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness.

ECBC, in conjunction with EAI Corporation in Abingdon, hosted a two-day workshop July 6 and 7 at Aberdeen Proving Ground to familiarize teachers and administrators with the issues and information related to terrorism and emergency response. Participants were introduced to critical incident response concepts and toured several research laboratories and engineering facilities.

"We're pleased to be able to lend our expertise in the area of homeland security and emergency preparedness to the school system," said Mary Doak, ECBC program manager for the curriculum development project.

ECBC was selected to serve on the Harford County Program Advisory Committee for the development of this first-in-the-nation high school curriculum in Homeland Security and


Emergency Preparedness, a program that will be piloted at Joppatowne High School.

"This is a completely unique program that may serve as a model for other school systems," she said.

ECBC helped conduct a needs assessment, established the Homeland Security Sciences Program Sequence and identified courses of instruction that would be taught under this sequence. ECBC also helped obtain program approval and secured funding for this pioneering effort. Because of its involvement in this program, ECBC was also selected to serve on a Maryland State Department of Education advisory council and was invited to participate at the national level working with the Department of Education.

Once students complete the required coursework, they will be able to fill critical positions within the Harford County area to include ECBC and APG as well as the supporting contractor infrastructure.

"Right now, ECBC is making an investment in the community. And we hope that in a few years, this program will have developed a group of knowledgeable experts groomed for employment at Aberdeen Proving Ground," Doak said.



High school students abhor them, parents love them

Online grades keep parents, students updated

"They" are the new Edline Accounts that allow high school students and their parents to view their child's instructional data throughout the 2006-2007 school year.

Parents can find the best dates and times to pick up their access code from the school office by looking on the school's Web page, on their newsletters or bulletins. Parents will need to present a picture ID to the school secretary.

Some schools may give students their activation codes in their homerooms.

It only takes a few minutes to setup a private account that gives the parent direct access to their child's important education information.

After getting the access code, go to www.edline.com. Click on "Is this a new activation?" Enter the access code. It must be entered correctly, because this will be used consistently. Type in a screen name and a password. Parents may have as many accounts as they have children in school.

Diligent HCPS teachers will design and publish Web pages that support the curriculum and their instruction. The students' missed assignments, homework grades, quizzes and test

scores will be on the sights. Some will even provide reviews and homework assistance.

Though teachers can change the information, students will have 'view-only' sites.

This online system gives parents an opportunity to become more involved in their child's education.

"Edline has been such a great tool for parents, not just to keep parents informed, but to help parents partner with the schools to improve students' achievements," said Cindy Mumby, president of Bel Air High School Parent Teacher Student Association.

The C. Milton Wright Edline Management Team provides this suggestion.

"Parents should not provide their Edline activation codes to their children. Parents and students are to have separate accounts, thus providing the ability for teachers to e-mail parents and students separately. Parents, please do not reveal your screen-name or password to your children. If your child has your password, please change it. Students will have a separate account and activation code."

Cell phones prohibited for some students

A policy statement on the use of cell phones, personal digital assistant devices, or PDAs, and laptop computers has been approved by Harford County Public School Board.

Student personal communication devices are not allowed in any elementary or middle school according to the HCPS Web site, <http://www.hcps.gov>.

No cell phones, PDAs or laptop computers shall be permitted in the possession of the students except:

- As required by a student's particular Individualized Education Plan.
- Lap top computers may be used when authorized by a teacher or administrator of HCPS.
- PDAs may be carried by high school students, but not in use or activated (or even seen by other students) during the regular school day.
- PDAs may be used by high school students

only before or after the regular school day.

PCDs shall not disrupt the educational environment or invade the privacy of other students. If violation of the above policy occurs:

1st Violation - The PCD will be relinquished to the administration, a conference with the principal will occur, and the parent must pick up the device.

2nd Violation - The PCD will be relinquished to the administration, after school detention will occur, and the parent must pick up the device.

3rd Violation - The PCD will be relinquished to the administration, two days of after school detention will occur and the parent must pick up the device.

4th Violation - The PCD will be relinquished to the administration, three days of suspension will occur, and the device will remain in the custody of the administration until the end of the school year. The parent may pick it up on the last day of school.

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APG school liaison officer seeks closer ties

The new Aberdeen Proving Ground school liaison officer hung her slate in July and since then she has been busy preparing for the upcoming school year.

Eileen Campbell, who has more than 18 years working with and around children – the last year as a training and curriculum specialist with the Aberdeen Child Development Center and 17 years with Harford County public and parochial schools – said she wouldn't have it any other way.

She attended a training conference hosted by the Military Child Education Coalition in Houston, Texas, shortly after assuming her duties and hit the ground running as soon as she got back.

Campbell said her mission and focus is on enhancing the educational experience for the children of military service members, active, National Guard and Reserve.

"My goals are simple," Campbell said. "First, connect families to agencies or groups that can assist them with parenting decisions," she said. "Next we need to diffuse the anxiety associated with moving from one school and community to another and the transition process overall. And finally to find ways to help children develop respectful attitudes through car-

ing mentors who promote hope and courage."

In addition to the new school year, Campbell said she is focusing on the installation's 90th anniversary which will include a year-long celebration in 2007.

"We are producing historical DVDs to share with nine high schools in an effort to interest students in participating in the celebration," Campbell said, adding that she hopes to have participants from the nine schools put together a standing art exhibit depicting the historical phases of the proving ground.

"Hopefully, they will come to APG and collaborate with their APG partners to gain a better idea of the services we provide," she said.

Other plans include maintaining and enhancing current partnership agreements between local schools and APG organizations and units, planning Month of the Military Child events and extending her focus to Cecil and Baltimore County schools. (See article below.)

"Right now we have a Memorandum of Agreement with Harford County, but if we find that there are APG children needing assistance at other schools we'll expand to those areas," Campbell said.

She stressed the importance of identifying military students within the local school systems.

"The needs of the military child are unique to those of other students," she said. "It is for this reason that I am working with the Harford County Public Schools to form lists of military connected students. We'd like to give them our support."

APG extends a hand to HCPS through partnerships

Aberdeen Proving Ground and Harford County Public and Private Schools share an understanding of the unique demands facing military students.

"Our students must transition more than two times during their high school years alone," reports the Army's Secondary Education Transition Study.

These moves come at a period in their lives that is fraught with transition, namely; puberty, increasingly-difficult school expectations, demanding activity schedules, social relations refinement, learning how to drive, responsibility for money management, and general uncertainty about their future careers.

The Military Child Education Coalition, MCEC, who assisted in the study, shared several goals to "reestablish the balance by reducing turbulence and enhancing well-being." (Gen. Eric K Shinseki, Oct. 17, 2000.)

MCEC goals are:

1. Promote practices which foster access to extracurricular programs.
2. Create and implement a professional development system.
3. Continue strong, child-centered partnerships between the installation and the supporting schools.

APG partnerships are making the effort to achieve all three objectives. Aberdeen and Edgewood high schools have sent teams composed of guidance counselors, teachers, and students to MCEC's Student to Student Transitioning Program (S2S) training. The course demonstrated methods of relating positively to peers through three research-based modules on academics, relationships and "finding the way."

"Its implementation at the two schools will serve as a model in all schools," said Ivan Mehosky, previous MWR/CYS School Liaison Officer. "It is the answer to the lack of connectedness so many children face."

In addition, HCPS middle and high school guidance counselors attended MCEC's Transition Counselor Institute training on post in the fall of 2005.

"This professional development provided techniques of identification and resolution of military children's concerns," Mehosky said.

APG partnerships

Partnership activities at the secondary level demonstrate the army's support of our schools with child-centered activities.

Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 61st Ordnance Battalion reached out through the "Be Proud" foundation event, serving as referees at baseball games, and mentoring Aberdeen High School students. Mehosky coordinated the C. Milton Wright High School Career

Day in February 2006.

Drs. Sandra Young and Rose Pesce-Rodriguez of the U.S. Army Research Laboratory coordinated efforts with the Aberdeen High School Science and Math Academy and prepared a summer program of math and science exploration for over 200 students.

Mentors from the Edgewood Chemical Biological Center encouraged over 250 students through their Program for Academic and Career Exploration, the Sophomore Tour of ECBC's Advanced Chemistry Laboratory and the Kids in Chemistry Program with local public school students. Other volunteers at ECBC participated in the National Chemistry Week at the Bel Air and Edgewood libraries.

Handling deployment issues

Deployment of a parent oversees is the transition of focus at many of the HCPS middle schools.

Student support teams have been formed at Aberdeen Middle School. The M Squad meetings take place with their counselor. Fallston Middle School holds a "Families in Transition" support group.

The Noncommissioned Officer Academy organized a 21st Century Drill Team to support strength of character in Aberdeen Middle School students.

Middle school career exploration was developed by the partnerships. APG Garrison commander Col. John T. Wright and representatives from the directorates of Safety, Health and Environment, and Law Enforcement and Security participated in this activity at St. Joan of Arc School. Harford Community College's "Back on Track" Program requested many APG civilians to share their career tips at the Edgewood Middle School Expo. Mentoring continued at both middle schools in Aberdeen and Edgewood.

Three of the busiest relationships have been at the elementary level.

MCEC's goal "to create and implement professional devel-

opment systems to ease the military child transitions" was carried out through the efforts of the 16th Ordnance Battalion and Roye-Williams Elementary School. They organized a teacher tour of APG and planned a day of Soldier substituting for teachers. Both groups of professionals came to understand the demands of the other. Susan Osborn, Roye-Williams' principal, recollected the swap at the most recent meeting on Aug. 14, while planning the 2006-2007 events.

"This event was a real eye-opener, you put in such long days," she said.

The MWR/CYS School Liaison Officer encouraged the Roye-Williams students' reading efforts with rewards for the "Star Reader Program." APG's Child and Youth Services refer to the children as 'Rising Stars.'

The 389th Army Band (AMC's Own) has joined efforts with Hall's Crossroads Elementary School in sharing their talents. Music lessons, concerts and special performances were great opportunities for the band to serve as role models.

One of the most active and enthusiastic partners, the U.S. Army Environmental Center, is already planning events for the 2006-2007 school year.

"Our partnership with Edgewood Elementary School is a wonderful thing to us," said Deborah Elliott, the USAEC Public Affairs and Corporate Communications Office point-of-contact for the program. "The leadership at the school is so supportive, and the kids are so smart and they're so much fun, that we get every bit as much out of it as we put in."

She said she enjoys talking about the special activities her group has planned for Veterans Day, Dr. Seuss' Birthday/Read-Aloud Day, Law Day, Arbor Day, and an end-of-year picnic.

These "strong child-centered partnerships between the installation and the schools" extend a hand and promote hope.

It's hard to believe "back to school" season is right around the corner, but that's what store displays have been telling [consumers] for weeks.

But, before blindly opening the wallet, parents should take a few moments to form a plan of attack. It could save a lot of time, money and aggravation. And, it's a great opportunity to educate children on how to budget for planned - and unplanned - expenses.

Make a list and set a budget. It's a good idea to know what needs to be purchased and how much is available to spend before going shopping, whether in a store or online. Having a defined back-to-school budget and sticking to it is essential.

For help creating a budget, go to Practical Money Skills for Life, www.practical-moneyskills.com. The site, run by Visa USA, contains a handy Back to School Calculator designed to help parents and their children determine school-related expenses, make necessary adjustments to stay within budget, and then hit the stores. The site also features a list of back-to-school budgeting tips for adults and children alike.

Needs vs. wants. A lot of

children (and many adults too) can't differentiate between "need to have" and "want to have" - a \$25 pair of gym sneakers versus the latest \$95 running shoes. While parents are mapping out the budget with their children, they

should take the opportunity to discuss the difference between these two extremes; it's far better to have this conversation at home than in a crowded department store.

Share the cost. When having the wants vs. needs discus-

sion, try a compromise. The parent should offer to pay for the basic item and the child can pay for the "upgrade" from their allowance, savings or additional chores. This provides a great education in what things truly cost and will help

children set priorities and feel like they are part of the decision-making process.

Share the savings. On the flip side, if after setting a budget and shopping for all necessary items on the list there is a balance, share the wealth by putting the savings into an account the children can tap into later for something they want, like a new toy or a CD.

Comparison shop. Involve children in looking for ways to save on back-to-school items, such as clipping coupons, watching for seasonal sales and comparison shopping online. This is a good way to learn how to avoid impulse buying, and is something that can be done together.

Timing is important. Some people buy gifts months in advance when things are on sale; others wait until the last minute and pay too much for

something they don't necessarily like, because selection is limited. Back to school shopping can work the same way. The sooner a parent finds out what is needed, the better to plan carefully and shop the sales.

Be a strong role model. Probably the best thing a parent can do to ensure children will become financially responsible adults is to teach them by example. Don't be afraid to openly discuss money matters and get them involved in budgeting decisions. Those kinds of life skills are just as important as what they'll learn when they go "back to school." Capturing a great first day of school

There's only one first day of school for every child, so taking a photo that accurately and effectively captures this historic event is important.

"If you have younger kids, don't leave them out of all the

photos," she said. "Make them part of the experience so they'll enjoy their turn when it comes."

Don't stop documenting family history.

"The first day of school is just that-the beginning. It needn't be the only time you get the camera out at school," Young

said. "Whether your children participate in sports, theatrics, marching band, or debate, attend their events and take pictures of the goings-on."

Students learn through hands-on experiments

The U.S. Army Research Laboratory hosted another year of Gains in the Education of Mathematics and Science, or GEMS, program at the Adelphi Laboratory Center and Aberdeen Proving Ground.

GEMS is designed to cultivate, encourage and increase an interest in the fields of mathematics, science and engineering in middle and high school students.

The program was held at the Weapons and Materials Research Directorate and was co-coordinated by Drs. Sandra Young, Rose Pesce-Rodriguez and Rob Lieb.

Ninety-two students, ages 12 through 18 from five different Maryland counties, Baltimore City and four different states (Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware and Massachusetts) as well as homeschool students, participated in the program that ran for four weeks in June, July and August.

During each week of GEMS, ARL hosted groups of up to 24 students broken into four teams of up to six students, who worked together for the entire week.

Three college students and three high school teachers were enlisted to assist scientists with the program. Nicole Eigenbrode, a junior at College of Notre Dame; Julia Leadore and Caroline Lochner, both juniors at the University of Delaware, worked

with the students assisting them with hands-on experiments and instrumentation and also learned more about polymer science, certain instrumentation techniques and about mentoring younger students.

Tuan Nguyen, MAX School, New Orleans, La., and Nathan Sloan, Aberdeen Science and Math Academy, also worked with the program over the summer.

"It was one of the best programs I have ever been involved with for teaching science to high school students," Sloan said. "As a science teacher you do not have access or the monetary means to purchase some of the equipment that was provided through the GEMS program.

"As a science teacher on a nearly daily basis science can get a bad reputation. I have encountered many students who are more hands-on learners. When I ask them about science they say they hate it, because it's too hard for them. If this type of student were exposed to the GEMS program, I think there might be a little more spark within them for science. That is my goal as a teacher. After working with the GEMS program this year I can say that it has lit a spark inside of me for science even more than I already had, and I hope it had the same effect on students. I will definitely be back next year to participate in any way I can with the program."

Donna Clem, director of SMA, coached students in science and math through experiments, helped them with presentation materials and encouraging them to start developing their professional networks.

There were a total of 14 hands-on experiments relating to polymers--either making polymers, using polymers to make something or on polymer properties--and five instrumentation sessions relating to polymers that students either made or that are in common use.

Experiments included making 'goop and slime' under the

direction of Gary Haas; making glyptal and nylon in the 'addition versus condensation reactions' and performing the ultraviolet experiment under the direction of Pesce-Rodriguez; making aluminum lap-shear panels in the 'adhesion' experiments under the direction of Andres Bunjanda, Dan DeSchepper and Rob Jension; learning about, making, and testing rubber under the direction of Dawn Crawford and Stephanie Piraino; and performing 'polymer swelling /density/film formation' experiments and doing an energy experiment under the direction of Young. They also participated in instrumentation sessions including the Fourier transform infrared experiment under the direction of Pam Kaste, Joyce Newberry and Stephanie Piraino; the scanning electron microscopy experiment under the direction of Stephen Howard and Lieb and the Tensile Testing and Gas Gun experiment under the direction of Andres Bujanda, Dan DeSchepper, Allan Gunnarsson, Paul Moy, Tusit Weerasooriya and Nathan Wells.

The question of "How is GEMS preparing you for your math and science classes for the upcoming school year?" was put to the students.

"It gave me skills and knowledge that will put me ahead in high school," said Alex Hutchenson, a ninth grader at C. Milton Wright.

Samantha Wade, an 11th grader at Perryville High School stated that GEMS has gotten her back into focus for school allowing her to have a hands-on experience and give her an advantage in school,

"GEMS is giving me the opportunity to work with new people while learning new things," said Maxwell Landbeck, an eighth grader at Southampton Middle School.

An icebreaker during the week of training was a bowling lunch session. It gave students a chance to have fun, meet students outside their teams and talk about their experience in the

GEMS program. The Maryland chapter of the American Chemical Society sponsored the bowling lunch and provided a pizza lunch for the parents and volunteers as part of the graduation ceremony.

The GEMS sessions concluded with a graduation ceremony that allowed each student to discuss what their expectations were before they arrived at GEMS, what they learned during the week, and what their favorite laboratory experiment or instrumentation session was.

Maj. Gen. Roger A. Nadeau, commander, APG and the U.S. Army Research Development and Engineering Command, and Jill Smith, director, ARL-WMRD, attended the last GEMS session.

Nadeau told the students that it was important that they have fun but it was most important that they take what they had learned and apply it to their future endeavors. He told them he was looking forward to hearing about what they liked and didn't like about the program. He told them that what they learned this week was just a taste of what actually goes on in support of the Soldier.

Nadeau presented each student with an RDECOM Commander's coin.

"GEMS is a significant leap forward for the Army in terms of level-of-effort for Educational Outreach," Young said. "The program goes beyond simply stating that children are our future and we need to do something to ensure that they are interested in math and science. The program implements a way for young students to see a future in math and science that is fun, challenging and inspiring. We are fortunate to have leaders in our organization who see the value in inspiring these young lives."

HCPS makes modifications in secondary schools

Scholars and/or athletes will see changes in the program offered by Harford County Public Schools this fall.

Eight high schools will experience the new 'block schedule.' The school system has also initiated a new zero tolerance, no 'E's' policy for students wishing to participate in their schools' sports or extra-curricular programs.

Harford's high schools program will be modified to a new block schedule. Students will have four 86-minute periods per day, in place of the seven periods rotating over a five-day cycle. The four courses will be taught every other day, using an A/B schedule option, students will earn as many as eight credits per year.

Jennifer Cook, 06/07 student representative for Harford County Public Schools Board of Education, was asked about both issues.

"The previous schedule was confusing to some,"

Cook said. "This schedule is simplified and allows students to earn the additional class credit."



Cook was pleased to be able to take two science classes, and she pointed out the benefits for students transferring from school to school within Harford County.

"It just makes sense. It will really help with athletic game scheduling and transportation issues," she said.

Aberdeen, Joppatowne, and North Harford schools are

already familiar with this scheduling, and other schools may now look forward to the benefit.

Starting with grade 10, high school students will be ineligible to play if they have even one E on their report cards of the previous semester.

"Our goal is to try to get them to be eligible whether they would play or not," said Jacqueline Haas, superintendent of HCPS.

"Honestly, in any educational system, participating in sports is a privilege, and education should be their priority," Cook said. "They [students] need to earn the right to play."

Schools that will see the greatest change in numbers of students participating in extra-curricular activities will be the Center for Educational Opportunity, Edgewood, Aberdeen and Havre de Grace High Schools.

"Their school improvement teams are investigating patterns of failures, as well as individual student and subject concerns," Haas said.

No Child Left Behind shares school effectiveness

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2002 requires greater accountability in the nation's schools.

Two of its main goals are to allow for greater local school system control and flexibility and encourage the use of educational methods based on scientific research.

More data on the schools' effectiveness is provided to parents on the Harford County Public Schools' Web site. Parents can review sites and consider their options.

The Maryland General Assembly enacted new legislation, "The Bridge to Excellence Act," and will increase funding of public schools over a five year period. It requires the

local school systems to develop a Master Plan that will help students "meet or exceed academic standards."

The HCPS Board of Education updated their goals in 2005. They are:

- Ensure a safe, positive learning environment for students and staff in HCPS schools.
- Accelerate student learning and eliminate gaps.
- Ensure the effective use of all resources focusing on the areas of technology, fiscal and budgetary management and community services.
- Understanding that all employees contribute to the learning environment, HCPS will maintain a highly qualified workforce.

The U.S. Army sponsors the activity to promote a greater interest in and understanding of science, math and technology in an effort to help students become more globally competitive.

Started by Gen. Eric Shinseki, former Army chief of staff, the vision for Ecybermission is to attain the same notoriety for the Army in science, math and technology that the Marines enjoy with their "Toys for Tots."

Understanding the difference between natural, artificial highs

Teaching children about substance abuse and explaining why some people abuse drugs and alcohol and why they shouldn't, can be very daunting.

The Aberdeen Proving Ground Army Substance Abuse Program has the answers.

Jareta Coyle, the Alcohol and Drug Control Officer at APG, offers some suggestions to help parents share their family values regarding substance abuse with their children.

She emphasizes the importance of parents communicating those values because "we know children learn their moralistic values in their family setting."

"They naturally want to be like their parents," Coyle said. "If you don't have those kinds of conversations with your children, someone else will."

Start by asking children why they crave their favorite foods.

"Point out that our brains reward us when we do something the brain likes," Coyle said. "This can be eating a good meal, riding a roller coaster, satisfying our thirst, getting hugs and kisses, making a home run, getting our hair brushed or our back tickled."

The brain processes positive stimuli and the chemical dopamine is released very deep in the brain, in the nucleus accumbens, which plays an important role in reward, pleasure and addiction.

"In other words, when you do something positive, your brain says 'nice job!' by releasing a chemical which makes you feel good. The more dopamine released, the better we feel," she said.

"When the brain rewards us in this way for certain behavior, we naturally want to repeat the behavior."

However, now humans have discovered shortcuts to get the brain rewards without having to do the work. These are the artificial rewards created by drugs and alcohol.

"It doesn't seem to matter which we abuse, our brain is tricked into releasing dopamine to make us feel good," Coyle said.

Drugs and alcohol also have a bigger kick than eating a good meal or drinking water. So some people become dependent on an artificial substance to feel good.

Often people who are in pain emotionally or physically look to chemicals to alleviate their discomfort instead of getting help for their problems. They could be experiencing loneliness, boredom, anxiety, shyness, depression, or any other number of emotional states or physical pain. For them, the attraction of drugs and alcohol is the escape from these feelings which then often leads to addiction as they repeat the behavior to get the brain's reward.

But after a while, their brain changes physically due to their

developing addiction and needs the alcohol or drug just to feel normal. At this point, they begin to use them just to avoid the unpleasant feelings they get when they quit using the chemical which has altered their brain.

"Those of us who have learned how to have fun, how to feel good, we have done so probably through trial and error," Coyle said. "It takes a little more practice sometimes, a little more skill, but it can be done."

"Having a hobby about which we are passionate; helping others to learn new skills or feel good about themselves; getting our thrills from sports; learning social skills which enable us to overcome our social shyness; falling in love: these are just a few of the many ways we get our rewards from within rather than seeking chemicals from without to make us feel good."

"Once you learn what makes you feel good, you will probably practice feeling good often. It becomes something you can control, unlike drugs and alcohol which come to control you," Coyle said.

There are no unpredictable side effects to natural highs, no risk, no guilt, no toxicity, no loss. The individual, not the drug, is in control.

"But what if you, as the parent, has the occasional alcoholic beverage? How do you impart to your children your concerns about their use of alcohol before they are grown," Coyle asked. "What if you come from a culture where small amounts of adult beverages are shared with children on special occasions?"

Coyle suggests parents keep in mind that their children are going to be influenced

more by parental behavior than by words.

"If they see you using alcohol to deal with stressful situations, for instance, they'll come to associate chemicals with solutions to problems," Coyle said. "If they see you practicing appropriate coping skills minus the chemicals, they too will learn from that."

The emphasis should be that these are adult beverages which adult bodies can handle, but growing bodies can't.

More and more evidence is linking early drinking to risk for alcohol dependence.

According to the July issue of the Archives of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine, 47 percent of those who began drinking at a young age (younger than age 14) experienced alcohol dependence during their lifetimes, compared with nine percent of those who began drinking at age 21 or older. Young bodies simply are not equipped to metabolize what is ultimately a toxic substance when consumed in quantity. The risk is there regardless of sex, race, educational level, family status, socioeconomic level, antisocial behavior history and smoking patterns.

So parents who can delay the onset of their children's drinking are in effect inoculating them against the disease we call alcoholism.

Good hand washing leads to staying healthy

Hand washing is the number one way to prevent illness, according to the American Medical Association.

With the start of school just around the corner, teaching children not to share objects that harbor germs is tough yet valuable information in preventing the spread of germs.

Germs spread easily when coughing or sneezing into the hands and when sharing food, cups, drinking glasses and other objects.

Prevention is the key to stop the spread of illness. Coughing or sneezing into a sleeve, if a tissue is not available, prevents the germs from spreading into the air to be breathed in by others.

The single most important action to stop spreading many diseases is proper hand wash-

ing, which is simple and effective.

Washing hands often during the cold and flu season can reduce the risk of catching or spreading illness.

An AMA survey reports that American children miss 22 million days of school each year due to illness. Children are known to contract 6.5 colds a year each lasting three to five days causing parents to lose an estimated 126 million work days a year. Teachers use 5.3 sick days per school year.

An alternate child care plan should be in place when a child is sick. Sending a sick child to school only spreads the illness to other students and teachers. Children, like adults, appreciate being in a comfortable place-like home-when they are not feeling well enough to participate in normal daily activities.

A national teacher survey



conducted by the Scholastic Publishing Company in 2004-2005, with 614 teachers completing the survey, reports that

their classrooms are clean but not disinfected by custodial services on a regular basis. Many teachers have been

known to purchase cleaning solutions with their own salary.

A simple disinfecting solution is one tablespoon of bleach per one quart of water mixed daily and sprayed on cleaned surfaces.

When to wash hands

- After using the toilet
- Before and after preparing or serving food
- Before eating or snacking
- After handling money
- After touching the ears, nose or mouth
- After playing with and touching animals

Washing hands properly

- Use warm water when possible. Cold water is not as effective for killing bacteria on the hands.
- Wet hands and wrist completely under running water.
- Apply a small amount of liquid soap.
- Work up a good lather and

wash all of the surfaces of the skin, including wrists, palms, backs of the hands, fingers and fingernails.

- Wash the hands for at least 15 to 20 seconds.

When teaching a child, ask them to sing their ABC's song while lathering and washing their hands.

Rinse the hands thoroughly under warm water.

Dry the hands. Use a paper towel to turn off the water after finishing. It is a good idea for parents to keep a roll of paper towels in the bathroom at home to encourage proper hand washing.

Hand sanitizers in the form of gel or alcohol based wipes are appropriate when water is not available. When using gel sanitizer, rub the hands until completely dry. Keep waterless hand cleaners readily available in the car and purse.

Gaining that much needed rest before heading off to school

As the new school year gets underway, it is important for students to get enough sleep.

Teachers and administrators across the nation are discussing ways to prevent yawning, sleep-deprived students from nodding off in class.

While school districts stay up late debating possible solutions, parents can make a difference and take proactive steps at home to alleviate students' daytime fatigue.

According to the Better Sleep Council, a non-profit organization dedicated to educating the public on the importance of quality sleep for good health, the first step in helping children from dozing off in school begins at home.

Parents are often told that "teaching a child about how to get a good night's sleep is as important as teaching them proper hygiene and nutrition," said Andrea Herman, director of the BSC.

"One very important thing that can be done to help a child sleep better is create a sleep-smart bedroom environment," Herman said.

Making a child's sleep environment more restful and sleep smart requires:

1. A good mattress/foundation

If a child has trouble falling asleep or complains of tossing and turning throughout the night, parents should consider the mattress as the reason. The BSC urges parents to take some time and consider whether the child's mattress is still doing its job — providing adequate comfort and support.

It is important to remember that as children's bodies grow and change, so do their mattress needs. The size that was right when initially bought may no longer be appropriate. Likewise, parents should not give hand-me-down bedding. A good rule of thumb: If a bed is no longer good enough for the parents, it's not good enough for children or teens, either.

2. Dim to no light

Keep the room dark—light is one of the most powerful time cues. The rising sun can stimulate the brain into wakefulness long before the alarm goes off. A dark room is the most conducive for a good night's sleep.

3. Reduce noise

Be aware of noise—from the television, loud conversations or music, for example—that could interrupt a child's sleep or prevent him or her from sleeping. Steady, low sounds like the whir of a fan or air conditioner can be helpful because they help block out other noises.

4. Maintain the right temperature

Keep the room at the ideal temperature — about 60 to 65 F. A room that's too hot or too cold can disrupt sleep.

Keeping children nutritionally fit

The new school year is quickly approaching with parents and children rushing to buy new school supplies, clothes, backpacks and lunchboxes.

With a parents "to-do" list overflowing and children being involved in several activities a week, "what's for breakfast, lunch, or dinner" is a last minute question and solution all rolled together. Life is no doubt busy, but with greater demands for children to excel in school and sports, a child's nutritional fitness should be a priority.

Being nutritionally fit means eating well so that a person has sustained mental and physical energy.

To ensure children are ready to greet the demands of the school year, parents must:

- Make sure their child eats breakfast within one hour of waking. There is no need for breakfast to be complicated or time-consuming. Serve a traditional bowl of cereal and milk, or try peanut butter and banana, cheese, crackers and a piece of fruit, a breakfast smoothie made with low-fat milk or yogurt, a bran muffin and lite chocolate milk, left-over cheese pizza, a waffle or pancake topped with fruit and yogurt, or a breakfast wrap made with scrambled egg, cheese and Canadian bacon.

- Make sure all meals served contain a combination of carbohydrates and protein. Carbohydrate foods include breads, cereals, pasta and rice, as well as fruits. Protein-rich foods include dairy foods, beef, chicken, fish, pork and eggs. Protein sustains appetite and controls highs and lows in blood sugar levels by slowing the digestive process. This in turn will allow a child to have sustained mental energy, and concentration in the classroom. Don't make the mistake of letting a child run out the door in the morning with only a granola bar and a glass of juice. They need protein.

- Ensure the child eats at least every four to five hours. The longest the average meal takes to digest, assuming it contains a combination of carbohydrate, protein, and fat, is five to six hours. Therefore, the child who has slept at least nine hours and then heads off to school without breakfast will be trying to function on an empty stomach. Whether or not they feel physical hunger, their mental energy will be dragging without a consistent fuel supply to the brain.

- Observe and learn about adequate portion sizes for children. A major contributor to childhood overweight issues today is portion-distortion. Everything is super-sized and children assume these portions are normal. Years ago, candy

bars were one-half to one-third of the size of candy bars today. For nutrition guidance for the whole family, refer to www.mypyramid.gov, for information and interactive tools that teach about the new Dietary Guidelines for Americans. This Web site offers personalized and practical tools for creating an eating and activity plan for each member in the household. Plus, the children can learn about proper nutrition through interactive games.

A child's growth and development are dependent on superior nutrition and regular physical activity. Be a positive role model for children and start the school year off right by following these four tips and developing a plan for the child's nutrition. Try not to survive on hit-or-miss meals and instead sit down as a family and create 10 breakfast, lunch, and dinner ideas that can be rotated throughout the school year. Involve children in reading cookbooks and recipes and allow them to select some new heart-healthy meal ideas.

Going to bed earlier--a healthy habit to practice before school begins

The new school year is only a few weeks away, but there is still time to begin getting children in the habit of going to bed earlier. Begin tackling tardiness before school starts.

A well rested child will be much more alert for the tasks ahead. This in turn will allow the child to be more alert, sustain mental energy and concentrate in the classroom.

If a student is late 10 minutes each day of the school year he misses 1,800 minutes of instruction time. That is 30 hours (five days) of lost learning time. Missing 30 hours of instruction definitely impacts a student's academic performance.

Tips to keep children on time for school

- Provide an alarm clock for student, if appropriate.
- Set "wake up time" and "departure time" a half hour earlier.
- Set books out the night before.
- Set out the next day's clothes the night before.
- Have all papers signed the night before.

- No caffeine before going to bed (especially on weekdays).
 - Keep an age appropriate and consistent bedtime on school nights--never after 10 p.m. to allow for 8 hours of sleep.
 - Have a set time for all morning tasks.
 - Allow one hour (or whatever predetermined time frame needed) to get dressed; eat breakfast, brush teeth and hair. Reserve television watching or play time for after school.

Making sure children eat healthy

The alarm rings and the daily race begins. Adults are getting ready for work and hope their children are moving along in their process of getting ready for school. A parent may have to drive them, or they may be running to catch the bus, or heading out the door to walk to school.

What's missing here? Most likely, it's breakfast.

Research suggests that skipping breakfast can affect a child's intellectual performance, and even moderate undernourishment can have lasting effects on long-term cognitive development.

Hungry children are more likely to have behavioral, emotional and academic problems at school.

If cost is a factor, the National School Breakfast and Lunch Program makes it affordable for children to eat at school if parents don't have the time to fix them something at home.

Participation in the National School Breakfast Program has been demonstrated to improve test scores, composite math and reading percentile scores, and class participation and also to reduce absences and tardiness.

Only 2 percent of school-aged children meet the Food Guide Pyramid's serving recommendations for all major food groups, yet more than 84 percent of school-aged children eat too much fat.

Maybe time isn't the issue, the child just doesn't like traditional breakfast foods. The key to breakfast is that parents want children to eat foods that will provide protein, carbohydrates and some fat.

It doesn't have to be traditional breakfast food. See the list below for some alternatives to

offer a child in the morning. These same foods can be offered for lunch or in smaller portions as after-school snacks.

To see how many portions of a particular food group a child needs, visit <http://www.mypyramid.gov> for an in-depth list, as well as additional helpful nutrition information.

Meals and snacks make for healthy living as they keep the energy level constant throughout the day and allow parents and children to stay focused on whatever they're doing.

Nutrition labels help inform consumers on how much of each nutrient is in each portion. Instructions on how to interpret a label are also found on the pyramid Web site.

Breakfast/lunch/snack suggestions:

- Peanut-butter and jelly sandwich (whole-grain bread if possible)
- Cottage cheese/fruit
- Yogurt
- Peanut butter on celery or apples
- Yogurt smoothies
- Cheese sandwich
- Instant breakfast with low-fat milk
- Tortilla with egg and/or cheese
- Dry cereal (mix high-fiber with a favorite cereal)
- Sliced cheese and crackers
- Fresh fruit or canned in its own juice
- Fresh vegetables with light salad dressing

Police advice curbs back to school anxiety

As summer activities and family vacations come to an end, the Aberdeen Proving Ground Police Community Policing Unit would like to recommend some helpful tips to start off the new school year.

Many parents and children look forward to the first day of school, while others experience anxiety.

Lots of attention and money will be spent on back to school items, but the most important thing a parent can do to prepare their child for a successful school year doesn't cost a thing.

It's very important for parents to set up a plan for two-way communication between themselves and teachers.

This will relieve a lot of the anxiety issues for the parent(s) and child as well as provide an opportunity for a meeting with the teacher, tour the school and become familiar with the classroom environment. This sends a message to the child that the parent(s) really cares about them and their education.

On APG a large majority of children ride a bus to and from school. The Community Policing Unit would like to remind children to follow these rules.

- Stay out of the street while waiting for the bus.
- Wait for the bus to come to a complete stop

before stepping off of the curb.

- Do not push or shove anyone into the street.

- Do not play in the street.
- Hold on to the hand rails while entering and exiting the bus.

- Stay seated on the bus until the bus driver says it is okay to move.

The Community Policing Unit understands that parents have concerns about sending their children off into the world of the unknown and the unit hopes to provide some comfort to those parents.

"Every child should be able to attend school feeling that he or she is in a safe and secure learning environment," said Maj. Joseph Darabasz, chief of Police Services Division.

Officer Michael Farlow, the community policing officer, has been working with state and local agencies in an effort to keep children on APG safe.

The APG Police Community Policing Unit has been invited to take part in the Maryland Crime Prevention Association Youth Committee which will address the crime prevention needs of our youth, according to Darabasz.

"Farlow was instrumental in developing the new and improved Drug Abuse Resistance Education [D.A.R.E.] program in the APG community with great success, and has plans to

expand the program this school year," Darabasz said. "We are very fortunate to have the D.A.R.E. program in our community."

"Our children are very precious to us and we all must ensure that they are safe at home and at school," Farlow said. "Times have changed, and the Community Policing Unit is trying to stay one step ahead."

Parents who are concerned about gangs should make sure their child doesn't need a gang to feel complete. Here are a few signs that a child might be in a gang:

- Changes in type of friends
- Changes in dress habits, such as wearing the same color combination all the time
- Gang symbols on books or clothing
- Tattoos
- Secretiveness about activities
- Extra cash from an unknown source
- Carrying or fascination with weapons
- Declining interest in school and family
- Getting in trouble with law enforcement

"If you notice these patterns, get help," Farlow said. "Contact the school counselor or the gang unit."

For gang issues on APG, contact Detective Christopher Real, 410-278-3609.

Parents who have concerns about bullying should contact the school counselor immediately. "Keep an open line of communication

between you and your child to let them know you care," Darabasz said.

For bullying, no one solution works well in every situation, but there are a variety of strategies to try:

- Avoid or ignore the bully.
- Hang out with friends. There is safety in numbers.
- Say no to a bully's demands from the start. If the bully threatens bodily harm with a weapon, give in to the demand and immediately tell an adult.
- Tell the bully assertively to stop threatening you. (For example, "I don't like what you are doing - stop it!")
- Do not physically fight back. Experience shows that this actually increases the likelihood of continued victimization.
- Seek immediate help from a trusted adult.
- Report bullying to school personnel.
- If safety is at stake, walk away or run if necessary.

"The APG Police Community Policing Unit would like to wish everyone a safe and happy school year. Getting to school safely: riding, walking, biking

Although riding on a school bus is generally safer than riding in a car, last year approximately 26 students were killed and another 9,000 were injured in incidents involving school buses. Most of these deaths and injuries didn't occur as a result of a crash. They occurred as students were entering or exiting the bus.

To better protect students, ensure there is a safe place for them to stand while waiting for the bus. In addition, parents need to review and reinforce -- again and again -- the following safety tips with their children.

- Stay away from traffic and the street.
- Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop and the driver signals them to enter.
- Roughhousing or other romping behavior can lead to carelessness and someone getting hurt.
- Do not stray onto streets, alleys or private property.
- Line up away from the street or road as the school bus approaches.

When exiting a bus, walk 10 giant steps away from the bus before stopping. This will keep a safe distance between the child and the bus. Also, remember that bus drivers can see students best when they are back away from the bus.

- Always use the handrail when entering and exiting a bus.
- Be aware of street traffic. Drivers are required to follow certain rules of the road concerning school buses, but sometimes they do not.
- When on the bus, find a seat and sit down. Loud talking or other noises distract the bus driver.
- Never put head, arms or hands out of the window.
- Keep aisles clear - books or bags are tripping hazards and can block the way in an emergency.
- Before reaching your stop, gather up books and belongings.
- When reaching the final destination stop, wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from the seat. Then, walk to the front door and exit, using the hand rail.
- If crossing the street in front of the bus, walk at least 10 feet ahead of the bus, along the side of the road, until the bus driver

can be seen.

- Before crossing the street, students should make sure that the driver can see them.
- Wait for a signal from the driver before beginning to cross.
- When the driver signals that it's okay to walk across the road, keep an eye out for sudden traffic changes.
- Do not cross the center line of the road until the driver has signaled that it is safe to begin walking.
- Stay away from the rear wheels of the bus at all times.
- Remember the correct way to cross the street —
— Always stop at the curb or the edge of the road and look left, then right, and then left again before crossing.
— Continue to look left, right, left until safely across.
— If a parked car or other obstacle is in the way, children should move to a position where the bus driver can see them and they can see other vehicles - then stop and look both ways again.

Walking to school

Even if children walk to school, they still have to protect themselves and be cautious of their surroundings. Because of minimal supervision, young pedestrians face a wide variety of dangers and must be prepared to make good decisions. Here are a few basic safety tips to share:

- Obey all traffic signals and/or the crossing guard - never cross the street against a light, even if there isn't any traffic coming.
- Walk with a buddy.
- Wear reflective or brightly colored material - it makes children more visible to street traffic.

Biking

- Always wear a bicycle helmet, no matter how short or long the ride.
- Ride on the right, in the same direction as auto traffic
- Walk the bike through intersections
- Use appropriate hand signals
- Respect traffic lights and stop signs
- Wear brightly-colored clothing to increase visibility
- Know the "rules of the road"

Riding in a car

Most traffic crashes occur close to home. Safety belts are the best form of protection passengers have in the event of a crash. Drivers and passengers wearing their seat belts properly lower their risk of injury by 45 percent. A person is four times more likely to be seriously injured or killed if ejected from a vehicle in a crash. Everyone needs to be buckled up properly. That means older children in seat belts, younger children in booster seats and little children in child safety seats.

Does your child ride in the back seat?

The back seat is generally the safest place in a crash. If the vehicle has a passenger air bag, it is essential for children 12 and under, as well as very small adults, to ride in back.

Facing the right way?

Infants should ride in rear facing restraints (in the back seat) until they reach age 1 and weigh at least 20-22 lbs. Infants who weigh 20 lbs. before age 1 should ride in a restraint approved for higher rear facing weights. Always read the child restraint manual for instructions on properly using the restraint. Children over 1 year weighing at least 20 lbs. may ride facing forward.

Does the safety belt hold the seat tightly in place?

Put the belt through the correct slots. If the safety seat can be used facing either way, use the correct belt path for each direc-

tion. Check the vehicle owner's manual and safety seat instruction book for guidance.

Is the harness buckled snugly around the child?

Keep harness straps snug over the child's shoulders. Place the chest clip at armpit level.


Does a child over 40 lbs. have the best protection possible?

Keep the child in a safety seat with a full harness as long as possible, at least until 40 lbs. Then use a belt-positioning booster seat which helps the adult lap and shoulder belt fit better. A belt-positioning booster seat is preferred for children between 40 and 80 lbs. It is used with the adult lap and shoulder belt.

How should a safety belt fit an older child?

The child should be tall enough to sit without slouching, with knees bent at the edge of the seat, with feet on the floor. The lap belt must fit low and tight across the upper thighs. The shoulder belt should rest over the shoulder and across the chest. Never put the shoulder belt under the arm or behind the child's back. The adult lap and shoulder belt system alone will not fit most children until they are at least 4 ft. 9 in. tall and weigh about 80 lbs.

School bus danger zones



The Danger Zone is the area on all sides of the bus where children are in the most danger of being hit. Children should stay ten feet away from the bus (or as far away as they can) and never go behind it. They should take five giant steps in front of the bus before crossing, so they can be seen by the driver.

Taking a load off - backpack safety

Choose a backpack with wide, padded shoulder straps and a padded back.

Pack light. Organize the backpack to use all of its compartments. Pack heavier items closest to the center of the back. The backpack should never weigh more than 10 to 20 percent of the student's body weight.

Always use both shoulder straps. Slinging a backpack over one shoulder can strain muscles. Wearing a backpack on one shoulder may also increase curvature of the spine.



Consider a rolling backpack. This type of backpack may be a good choice for students who must tote a heavy load, but remember that rolling backpacks still must be carried up stairs, and will be difficult to roll in snow.

Dealing with a 'bully'

American Academy of Pediatrics

Bullying is when one child picks on another child repeatedly. Usually children being bullied are either weaker or smaller, shy, and generally feel helpless.

Bullying can be physical, verbal or social. It can happen at school, on the playground, on the school bus, in the neighborhood or over the Internet.

When a child is bullied

- Help children learn how to respond by teaching them how to:
Look the bully in the eye.
Stand tall and stay calm in a difficult situation.
Walk away.
- Teach children how to say in a firm voice.
"I don't like what you are doing."

"Please do not talk to me like that."
"Why would you say that?"

- Teach children when and how to ask for help.
- Encourage children to make friends with other children.
- Support activities that interest children.
- Alert school officials to the problems and work with them on solutions.
- Make sure an adult who knows about the bullying can watch out for the children's safety and well-being when their parent cannot be there.
- When your child is the bully
 - Be sure the child knows that bullying is never okay.
 - Set firm and consistent limits on the child's aggressive behavior.

- Be a positive role model. Show children they can get what they want without teasing, threatening or hurting someone.

- Use effective, non-physical discipline, such as loss of privileges.
- Develop practical solutions with the school principal, teachers, counselors, and parents of the children your child has bullied.

When the child is a bystander

- Tell children not to cheer on or even quietly watch bullying.
- Encourage children to tell a trusted adult about the bullying.
- Help children support other children who may be bullied. Encourage the child to include these children in activities.
- Encourage children to join with others in telling bullies to stop.

If I haven't been directed to a new government publication in my "researching" about every two weeks, I will routinely visit my special Web site, the ED PUBS on-line ordering system at <http://www.ed.gov/pubs/edpubs.html>.

I decided to check on the top 10 publications to see what everyone was ordering free from our federal government. Now, this isn't David Letterman's top 10 list, nor is it the New York Times best seller list, but I think you'll quickly get the point I'd like to make.

1. "Helping Your Child Become a Reader"
2. "Helping Your Child Learn History"
3. "Helping Your Child Learn Mathematics"
4. "Helping Your Child Learn Science"
5. "Helping Your Child Succeed in School"
6. "Helping Your Child With Homework: For Parents of Children in Elementary Through Middle School"
7. "Helping Your Preschool Child"
8. "No Child Left Behind: A Toolkit for Teachers (Revised Booklet)"
9. [Parent] "Put Reading First: Helping Your Child Learn to Read: A Parent Guide. Preschool Through Grade 3" (brochure)
10. [Teaching] "Put Reading First: The Research Building Blocks For Teaching Children To Read: Kindergarten Through Grade 3"

The "Helping Your Child" books follow similar formats. First, they introduce the basics and then follow up with age/grade-appropriate activities that can be completed by parent and child, either at home or in the community. These generally provide activities for students through grade 5, depending on the subject. All publications provide hints on how to work with teachers and schools and then suggest lots of resources including publications, Web sites, and more. And for those of you who work with bilingual parents, the whole series is available in Spanish.

The question-and-answer section in "Helping your Child Succeed in School" provides a positive approach for effective communications with teachers. "Helping Your Child with Homework" gives parents guidelines on how to help, provide guidance, monitor assignments and talk with teachers to resolve problems.

Although not in the top 10, the "Helping" series devotes separate books to working with the preschool child and the early adolescent, "Helping Your Preschool Child" and "Helping Your Child Through Early Adolescence."

With two grandchildren in 6th and 7th grade this year, I read this one from cover to cover and took special note on "Being an Effective Parent," "Communication" and "Limits." The "Tips to Help Your Child through Early Adolescence" are common sense hints written down in one place.

I've failed to mention that the "Helping" series is really part of the Department of Education's "Tools for Student Success." The tools include some wonderful publications here for the parent of a child who is learning to read. Note the first publication begins with birth.

- A Child Becomes a Reader: Proven Ideas for Parents from Research – Birth to Preschool
 - A Child Becomes a Reader: Proven Ideas for Parents from Research – Kindergarten through Grade 3
 - Put Reading First: Helping Your Child Learn to Read (9 and 10 on the top ten)
- You can download any publication or read



it online. On this visit, several publications were out of stock and had to be back ordered. The good news is -- all booklets are in the public domain. Authorization to reproduce the booklets in whole or in part for educational purposes is granted. See the citation on the inside cover of each booklet for the reproduction information.

Now, where do you find all these great materials? Go to ED PUBS Online, <http://www.edpubs.org/webstore/Content/search.asp>. When I visit ED PUBS, I normally look at the "Recently Added Publications"--see the link at the left of the screen. This helps me to find any new publications that I may not have been alerted to through my newsletters, etc.

Now, I know you want to know if you can register to receive newsletters from the Department of Education. Absolutely. Just in case you don't find "Newsletters and Journals," use this link, <http://www.ed.gov/news/newsletters/index.html>. Currently, there are nine newsletters or journals for which you can register. If you've been following No Child Left Behind then you want to sign up for The Achiever and Extra Credit. Look down the list for other areas of interest and then sign up.

You can even stay current with upcoming broadcasts of Education News. The series is often carried on the Public Broadcasting Service or national cable outlets including The Learning Channel.

Find the Frequently Asked Questions on Education News at this site <http://www.ed.gov/news/av/video/edtv/faq.html> and then follow through to the broadcast schedule for programs and to find out if there is a site in your state to view the broadcasts. The Oct. 19, 2004, program was "Supplemental Services: Helping All Student Achieve" and the Nov. 16, 2004, program was "Dropout Prevention: Catching Students Before It's Too Late." You might want to try to order a transcript of these programs.

Before I close, I'd like to share the alternate ordering information for ED PUBS. You'll need this especially if you want to order multiple copies of a publication.

Taking the mystery out of Homeschooling

We want to help families considering homeschooling, and take the mystery away for those who are curious.

No doubt, if you are a homeschooler or considering the leap yourself, there are many things to consider. No pressure, but the entire fate of your child's education lies in your disorganized hands. (Or is that just us?)

Parents choosing the homeschool path have to overcome many obstacles. Not only is it necessary to consider the physical aspects of choosing a curriculum, knowing the rules and making the connections, but you must also overcome the mental snags that can trip you up.

In the next few paragraphs we will address the dreaded socialization questions, the child's education and the parent's sanity. These subjects seem to cause the most controversy.

First, we will address the stereotype of socialization--the weird kids who do not have the ability to interact with other young kids since they live in a bubble, right?

We think socialization is the number one question that has been posed to us and probably one of our bigger concerns.

Most people can't get past the misconception that homeschool children will ultimately become sheltered alien children that have little to no social skills in the real world.

We must tell you, there are real concerns about the kids becoming different from other children. However, has anyone noticed the attitudes and actions of some children that we want our children to socialize with? Is it really so wrong to allow innocence to dwell in our kids for just a while longer?

Unfortunately, our children are exposed to so many kids who continuously view games, movies and music that would make an adult blush. Please, do not misunderstand; we are not advocating homeschool for the "sheltering" aspect. On the contrary, homeschooled children, if properly guided, have plenty of opportunities for peer interactions through city sports, co-ops*, umbrella groups*, church and scout groups and more. That leaves plenty of birthday parties, outings and sleepovers with friends to fill a calendar year with no problem.

Another benefit of homeschooling is having a relationship with the friends your children spend time with. As a homeschooler, you simply have the ability to know what your children are exposed to for just a bit longer as their attitudes and understanding of the world develops.

The second subject of concern is the academic aspect of teaching at home.

Before my [Laura Allen] final decision to homeschool, I made a phone call. Since we are a military family, there is a chance that one of our children might decide to choose the military as a career. With that in mind, I called the mother (or father) of all schools, the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. I asked the officer who answered the phone if they accept homeschooled children.

To my very pleasant surprise, he informed me, most assuredly, that they accept homeschooled children every year. He offered a few tips to make sure they qualify when the time is right. He said that every homeschooler that applies has no problem qualifying academically; they are usually at the top of the charts. He also told me to keep them in sports, scouts, church and they should be fine. What a relief! If West Point considers homeschooled children an asset there might be something to it.

Do not be afraid of teaching your children, by the way. The books are scripted and lesson plans are drawn out for you, if you wish.

Keep in mind that APG has a homeschool co-op* where we help each other teach and guide the children in various subjects. You are not alone.

For the final and most important facet of homeschooling we really need to be focusing on our own needs for a moment. Just put aside socialization and academics.

We want to talk about the sensitive nerves and short fuse that most of us acquire, miraculously, upon our child's birth. It wasn't there before, so where did it come from? Let's talk about a parents' ability to spend 24 hours a day with their children. No more coffee and cheese-cake outings with the friends, no more grocery shopping alone and no more time to take naps in a quiet house during the day around 11-ish.

These are very valid concerns and they are in

our opinion, one of the biggest obstacles to overcome. You must wake up one day, and make a decision, the hardest decision of your life. You have to decide if you are willing to sacrifice your own comfort for the well being of your little ones.

Again, please understand, we completely believe that private and public schools can be a wonderful place for a child to develop as long as the parents are involved. However, if you have a place in your heart where you know homeschooling has always been tugging at, then you must be willing to give up a few pleasures of your own.

What you get in place of that 11 a.m. nap is the benefit of knowing your children, not just knowing about them. It is amazing what you learn about them when you slow the fast paced life and enjoy time with your kids. This is important whether you homeschool or not. You get to watch all of their light bulb moments as they begin to grasp a subject. You get the peace of mind that you know who is influencing your child, and most of all, you get off season rates when you go on vacation. Did we say that out loud?

Seriously, know there is a huge support system out there. You are not alone and if you are the family member or friend of a homeschooler, remember, the only reason it seems strange is because it is still a mystery to you. Ask questions and take the mystery out of it.

LIONS Homeschool Co-op

The APG LIONS (Learning In One's Natural Style) Homeschool Co-op is a group of parents and homeschooled youths who meet weekly for classes, projects, physical fitness and other activities. Academic classes are conducted by the parents and guest instructors may be on hand for special projects.

The Co-Op meets every Wednesday 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. beginning Sept. 13 at the Aberdeen Youth Center. Membership is open to all government ID card holders.

Parents who are homeschooling for the first time are encouraged to join.

There are many reasons to join a co-op. Some parents like to use the co-op for core classes such as history, science, gym, health and art. This means the co-op provides the main instruction for some students taking the load off of mom and dad.

Also, the co-op provides additional learning for children in addition to their current curriculum such as Bob Jones, Abeka, or other curriculums. Either way the time spent at a co-op should be structured, fun and stress free for both child and parent.

The LIONS Co-op also provides a time for students to interact with each other. Whether it is in a class, the gym, or sitting around having lunch together they get to connect with someone other than the teacher in their lives. Most parents bring sack lunches and enjoy a time of fellowship and networking with other parents as well.

The Co-op is all about a partnership between parents, each taking turns teaching classes or helping out in areas that they feel comfortable in. The different skills and talents we can offer to others is what make the program so successful. Whether it is teaching children to play chess or teaching them to read sheet music, that commitment can go a long way.

Come out and join the LIONS Homeschool Co-op every Wednesday to see what the LIONS have to offer your child and to share what you have to offer others.

While extracurricular activities can provide children an opportunity to learn important skills, some families today overdo it.

Children of past generations might enjoy one activity per week, while today's child may be attending as many as two per day. Some children are involved in sports every season and also enrolled in dance class, music lessons, karate instruction, swimming lessons, and more.

Some children excel in the

extracurricular, in fact a few students remark that a busy schedule "forces them to be more organized."

College-bound teens consider extracurricular activities essential in balancing their applications. Parents of elementary-aged children find them a solution to the babysitting dilemma, while the activities enrich the mind and are much preferable to television viewing.

Still, others think it's stressful to be rushed from one activity to the next.

It is also tiring to be in an organized program all day (in school) and then be taken to yet another class in the evening.

Children need time to play, relax and explore while using their imaginations.

Also, the reduction of contact with the family and time

to develop close friends could be a hindrance to our youngsters' social skills.

We should ask ourselves several questions if we suspect over-programming:

- Is this activity good for my child's self-esteem?
- Is this something the child is interested in and enjoys doing?
- Is the child overly tired?
- Has the child begun to exhibit behavior problems not previously present?

If the answer to any of these questions is yes, it may be time to rethink the extracurricular schedule.

Youth centers offer relief for parents

The three words, "Back to school," are the cause of anxiety and excitement for children and parents alike. There are back-to-school sales for everything from clothing to school supplies, taking last-minute vacations, and then there's the task of making arrangements for care for children and youths.

Aberdeen Proving Ground Youth Service centers (one in Aberdeen and another in Edgewood) can relieve this problem for parents, offering a worry-free place for school-age, middle and high school children.

Both centers meet Department of Defense and Department of the Army standards to conduct school-age programs. This certification is APG's "license to operate" and is considered to be the equivalent of state licensing.

"We are also accredited by the National After School Association," said Norma Warwick, director of Aberdeen YS. "This national accredi-

tation focuses on a higher level of performance than DOD certification and is measured against national standards and professional benchmarks."

The centers offer four core service areas daily: sports, fitness and health options; life skills, citizenship and leadership opportunities; arts, recreation and leisure activities; and academic support, mentoring and intervention services.

There are options and services available in all CYS programs for school age children, middle school youths and teens. Partnerships exist with schools and MWR activities and include affiliate membership in Boys & Girls Club of America and active 4-H Clubs. The Baseline Programs are Technology Lab(s), Homework Center(s), a Youth Council, Youth Sponsorship, Games and Leisure Activities, Volunteer Community Service Opportunities, Workforce Preparation, Individual/Group Sports & Fitness Activities, Affiliate memberships in Boys & Girls Club of America and active 4-H Clubs.

"If all of this sounds like a place you want

your school-age, middle school and high school children to spend their time, the first step is to determine what you're looking for in terms of child care and recreational activities," Warwick said. "APG's Youth Services offers Before and After School Programs, Open Recreation Programs, and are the host locations for several sports and instructional programs."

This facility boasts several activity rooms, including an art room, game rooms, middle school room, teen lounge, dance room, snack bar, technology lab, homework center, gymnasium and two outdoor patios.

"Parents of children with disabilities must become the best advocate they can be for their children," said Exceptional Family Member Program coordinator Isolda McClelland.

"This is especially important when working with the local school system, whether the child is just entering preschool or graduating from high school. A parent's involvement will help make school less frustrating for the parent and the child," she said.

"As the parent of a child with special needs I have found connecting with the school or teacher eased my anxiety about the upcoming school year."

Transitioning can be a challenging experience to a child

with special needs. Whether they are moving to a new school or going to the next grade level, no matter what change is hard, but there are ways to make it easier for the entire family.

To help make this school year a successful one

- If enrolled in the EFMP, contact McClelland, 410-278-2420.

- Coordinate with the APG School Liaison Officer Eileen Campbell, 410-278-2857.

- Find the location of the school and test drive the child to and from school a few times in advance to get them use to the route and scenery.

- Get to know the community resources and join other parents who may be experiencing the same concerns through the Army Community Service Parent Information

Exchange Support group or local support groups within the community.

- Set up meetings in advance if the child has an Individual Education Plan or Sec. 504 plan, from a previous school or the child has reached written milestones (then it is time to review the plan for accuracy). This can be done at any time not just once a year.

- Be proactive, do research, get involved with the child's learning and make it fun.

"One piece of advice I usually give parents is to stay involved with their child's education, support it and guide it and they will see success," McClelland said.

APG tech labs promote Internet safety

The Internet can be a helpful and fun place for children to learn and grow. It is a place where they can get help with their homework, do research, and have fun, but there are places on the Internet that children should avoid.

To help keep children safe while using the Internet, here are some suggestions that can be followed, all of which are followed in the Aberdeen Proving Ground Child and Youth Services Technology Labs.

- Make sure the computer is in a common area of the house, like the family room. There are places on the Internet that are

not safe for children. Having supervision can help them if they come across something that they shouldn't. An adult would not let a child go outside and go wherever they want, so the same should be true of letting them go out on the Internet.

- Discuss boundaries for what is and isn't appropriate online. Having honest and open discussions about using the computer will help children to know that they can be honest and open with their parents. Set the rules for their Internet use together.

- Use the Internet together. Not only is this an easy way to see what Web sites children are visiting, but it can also be

an easy way to spend time with children.

NetSmartz (<http://www.netismartz.org>) is a program used in APG Youth Technology Labs in both Youth Centers that has been developed by the Center for Missing and Exploited Children. It uses animated characters to teach youths how to be safe on the Internet and what to do if they come across something that makes them feel uncomfortable. They have a section on their Web site to help parents know how to help their children when using the Internet.

Using principles to keep children safe in the real world can also keep children safe on the Internet.

Signs that a child may be at risk

A child spends large amounts of time online, especially at night.

Monitoring children's Internet usage can be beneficial in keeping them safe from Internet predators. Children are especially at risk online at night. Although sex offenders can be online any time of day, most have daytime jobs. This means they search for children online in the evenings.

A parent finds pornography on their child's computer.

Online sexual predators frequently send pornography to their potential victims to start sexual conversations and seduction. Sex offenders may send children pornography to make them think that sex between adults and children is acceptable.

A child receives phone calls from someone or adults the parents don't know or is making calls, sometimes long distance, to numbers unknown.

Although sex offenders feel excited while talking to children online, most want to talk

to them on the phone. Sex offenders frequently become involved in phone sex with children and try to schedule a meeting time to have real sex.

Even if children do not give out their numbers, the sex offenders will give children theirs. They try to get children to call them to obtain their numbers off of Caller ID. Some sex offenders gave children a toll free 800 number or have them call collect so that the parents won't find out.

A child receives mail, gifts or packages from someone the parents don't know.

While the sex offender is trying to seduce a potential victim, they may send letters, photographs or other kinds of gifts. Some have sent plane tickets so that children would fly across the country to see them.

School closings--Understanding inclement weather, emergency procedures

Specific procedures are required to provide clear directions for closing schools, delayed openings, early dismissals and cancellation of school activities because of inclement weather or other emergencies.

Since each situation is unique, the Superintendent of Schools must make decisions at various times during the day, and those decisions must be communicated.

Essentially there are three scenarios for which procedures are developed. They are closing schools for students; closing schools and offices; closing schools and offices with 'Essential personnel' reporting.

Schools closed: Code BLUE --"Harford County Public Schools are closed today."

This means that schools are closed for students and teachers. School offices and school system central offices will open on time. All

evening activities are cancelled.

Schools and School Offices Closed: Code RED--"Harford County Public Schools and offices are closed. No second shift custodians on duty. All evening activities are cancelled."

This means that all schools, school offices and central offices are closed. All daycare and all evening activities are cancelled. No second shift custodians on duty.

Schools and School Offices Closed: Code GREEN--"Harford County Public Schools and offices are closed. 'Essential personnel' report for duty (in accordance with 8082.00). No second shift custodians on duty. All evening activities are cancelled.

This means that all schools and offices are closed. Only those identified as 'Essential personnel' will report according to specific directions upon arrival. No second shift custodians on duty. All daycare and all evening activities are cancelled.

The members include civilian, officer and enlisted spouses. "Its purpose is to provide a





