Army study confirms recreation, Family programs are directly linked to readiness and retention

The Army has announced results from a recently completed ground-breaking study that identified positive, measurable links between Soldiers' use of recreation, Family programs and readiness and retention.

The study, funded by the Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation Command, found a significant relationship and a positive, direct link between active duty Soldiers' use of recreation and Family programs and their desire to stay in the Army, their career intentions and their satisfaction with Army life.

These links also held true for program use by the spouses of active duty Soldiers.

"Having grown up myself in a military Family and then marrying an Army officer, I know personally as well as professionally how important recreation and Family programs are in the lives of Soldiers and their Family members," said Regina Dannenfels, director of Aberdeen Proving Ground MWR.

"Now we can demonstrate that the recreation and Family programs we have in place do make a difference," said Brig. Gen. Belinda Pinckney, FMWRC commander.

The study measured the strength of the links in terms of overall program use and against four distinct groups of programs: Child and Youth Programs and Services; Sports and Fitness Programs; Food and Beverage Operations; and Recreation, Tour and Travel, and Library Programs and Services.

The research also revealed a link between Soldiers' use of recreation and Family programs and their emotional attachment to the Army. The Soldiers' emotional attachment to the Army was found to have a very strong link to readiness and retention outcomes.

Of particular note is the finding that readiness and retention increase as program use increases, but these programs are used less frequently by junior officers and enlisted Soldiers and their spouses.

"We can strengthen the readiness of the Army by doing two things," Pinckney

said. "Ensure that recreation and Family programs meet the needs of Soldiers and their Families, and increase their awareness of these programs."

The study, conducted by independent researchers, focused on two Army-wide

surveys of Soldiers and two of spouses, containing responses from more than 25,000 Soldiers and 23,000 spouses. The researchers determined whether statistical significance existed between program use and the readiness and retention

outcomes and then measured the strength ("effect size") of the associations.

Army survey data have consistently indicated that Soldiers and Families value recreation and Family programs, use

SUV, pickup fatalities on the rise

Compared to 19 fatalities recorded in fiscal year 2006 involving sports-utility vehicles and pickup trucks, to date in fiscal year 2007, the Army has experienced an increase in the number of fatalities involving these type of vehicles.

At the halfway point of this FY, according to the Army database, there have been 50 fatal privately owned vehicle off-duty accidents, claiming the lives of 54 Soldiers. Of this number, 24 accidents included SUV and truck fatalities.

"The increase in pickup truck and SUV fatalities is proportional to the increase in the number of registrations the Army is experiencing and the sales [nationally] of these type vehicles," said Walter Beckman, deputy of Driving Task Force, U.S. Army Combat Readiness/Safety Center. "One reason the Army may be seeing this increase is because Soldiers have more disposable income coming out of theater and are buying the bigger more expensive SUVs and pickups."

Beckman's explanation of the number of SUV fatalities coincides with the number of increased vehicle registrations being recorded at Army posts. The Army's Office of the Provost Marshal General indicates there were 71,573 SUVs registered in 2006, a 21 percent jump from 56,826 registered in 2005.

Risk assessment, however, is one of many Army resources equipping Soldiers for potential hazards such as POV accidents.

"Risk assessments are paramount in

preventing our Soldiers from becoming another horrific statistic," said USACRSC Command Sgt. Maj. Tod Glidewell. "It is my hope, as engaged leaders, that we will encourage those within our ranks to use the programs and tools that the Army has to offer such as the Travel Risk Planning System."

The Army's TRiPs program is one of the tools that combat the hazards associated with operating POVs.

TRiPs offers key features such as encouraging dialogue between supervisors and subordinates. This allows them the opportunity to discuss the planned trip, the risks involved and how to control those risks with the Soldier.

Since its inception, Soldiers have completed more than 2.3 million assessments. Of those people who completed the assessments, four have been killed with only two of those actually operating the vehicle. Soldiers complete roughly 3,000 to 5,000 assessments a day.

Because of programs such as TRiPs, in comparison to two-to-three years ago, the Army is seeing positive results, such as fewer fatalities involving off-duty accidents. However, these numbers are not acceptable to the Army.

"One is too many, especially if it is your battle-buddy or loved one," Glidewell said.

"Our statistics indicate that our younger Soldiers are more at risk when it comes to off-duty accidents involving SUV's," Glidewell added. "We must all continue stepping up and helping fellow Soldiers make the right decisions. If we continue to do this, we'll be more successful in reducing loss and remaining an Army Strong."

Veterinary Treatment Facility expanding service

Thanks to the return of a one-time Army veterinarian turned civilian doctor, the Post Veterinary Treatment Facility, located in building 2479, has been able to expand the treatment hours and services it provides to its customers and their pets.

Former Capt. Heidi Loheide, who served at Aberdeen Proving Ground from August 2001 to January 2005, is now Dr. Heidi Bazar, the post veterinarian.

Bazar left the Army after nine years during which she also served in the Great Lakes Naval Training Center, Chicago; Fort Stewart, Ga.; and in Korea. A resident of Cecil County, Bazar said that after leaving the military she started a Family and furthered her education.

Already holding a doctorate in veterinary medicine from Iowa State University, she attended Johns Hopkins University and received her master's in public health specializing in infectious diseases earlier this year.

Bazar said that she is happy to be back because of what the presence of a part-time veterinarian means for VTF customers.

"We have a three day-a-week clinic now which is nearly twice what they had before," she said. "We should be able to provide even more services."

Along with Bazar there are two technicians on staff to help with routine procedures such as vaccinations and heartworm checks while Bazar tends to sick call patients.

Bazar said that some of her concerns include the increase of Lyme disease in Maryland in pets and

people.

"People should be getting their pets tested every year," she said, adding that she will be reinforcing that and other information to VTF clients.

She noted that the VTF no longer houses strays or abandoned animals for adoption.

Harford County has assumed the responsibility for all reported strays, Bazar added.

"To report strays, call the Directorate of Law Enforcement and Security who will then contact the county," she said.

She added that DLES should also be contacted in the event of suspected abuse or neglect of a pet on post.

"They will then contact us, but report it to the police first," he said.

Bazar said that she remains enthusiastic about serving the community.

"People can expect me to treat them and their animals with respect, to work as hard as I can to correct any health issue and to provide the best care I am able to," she said. "The clinic will be more accessible now, and we look forward to providing better services to the APG community. This is one of your privileges, and we are happy to serve you."

Owning a pet on APG

The Post VTF operates 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. for over-the-counter sales and 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for appointments Monday thru Friday and is closed the last business day of the month and on federal holidays.

Dogs and cats are seen by appointment only. All animals must be on a leash or in a carrier.

Due to safety reasons and limited space, children under age 12 are not permitted inside the VTF.

In addition to AAFES' pledge to open additional registers anytime more than three shoppers are in line, BXs and PXs across the globe are holding recurring training to ensure enough checkout lanes are opened and staffed to keep lines moving quickly. Updated training materials include a daily checklist for supervisors and cashiers to use everyday at Central Checkouts that is expected to maximize productivity and customer satisfaction. Signing away history



Micro-chipping is mandatory for pets residing on military installations.

For appointments or more information, call the VTF at 410-278-3911/4604.

Registration – Animal owners who reside on post must register their dogs and cats at the VTF within 10 days of arrival. Proof of rabies vaccination must be presented at this time and all cats and dogs must be micro-chipped. Cats, dogs and ferrets older than four months are required to

be vaccinated against rabies in accordance with APG post regulations and Maryland state law.

Exotic animals – Introduction of animals other than domestic dogs and cats, small birds and small rodents is prohibited. Requests for exception to policy may be submitted through the VTF to the Garrison commander. Owners of exotic animals residing off-post who are authorized to use the VTF should call for more information.

Handling stray animals – Pets must be leashed and under the direct control of the owner when outdoors. It is understood that animals may occasionally escape from time to time.

When this occurs, stray animals are picked up by Harford County Animal Control and

taken to the Humane Society of Harford County located in Fallston. The Humane Society requires proof of vaccinations and some form of proof of ownership prior to releasing animals from their facilities. They also charge a fee for the impoundment. For more information, call the Humane Society, 410-836-1090.

Animal bites – Regulations dictate that if a pet bites a person on APG, that animal must be subject to quarantine as determined by the post veterinarian. If a stray or wild animal bites a person it needs to be reported immediately. Call the VTF as soon as possible if a stray or wild animal bites a person or a pet.

Shipment of animals – Shipping animals within the United States or overseas is usually uncomplicated if arrangements are made in advance. As a general rule, most countries and states require that all vaccinations be greater than 30 days but not more than one year old, that all pets have an Avid or Home Again Microchip and a health certificate issued within 10 days of shipment. Some may require a FAVN (rabies) blood test months in advance. Personnel on PCS orders, especially for overseas travel, should contact the VTF to learn shipment requirements as soon as possible. Don't forget to pick up pet records when PCSing.

BACK TO SCHOOL GUIDE



APG leaders learn about Joppatowne High's new homeland security curriculum

A Joppatowne High School teacher informed Aberdeen Proving Ground leaders and Harford County schools' faculty members about a new Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness curriculum that will be offered this fall during a school partnership meeting Aug. 7.

Leah Beaulieu, HSEP program coordinator and curriculum teacher, told leaders about the program that will be offered to 10th-grade students at Joppatowne. The leaders who attended the partnership included Col. Jeffrey Weissman, APG Garrison and deputy installation commander; Garrison Command Sgt. Maj. Pedro Rodriguez and Col. Bobby Towery, commander of the 61st Ordnance Brigade and the U.S. Army Ordnance Mechanical Maintenance School.

"We are very excited about the program that is starting this fall," Beaulieu said.

Beaulieu said that the HSEP committee would like APG military and civilian employees to review the curriculum and make sure "it is up to professional standards."

They would also like APG employees to visit the classroom and speak to the students about homeland security.

She said the program will be a series of courses about homeland security and emergency preparedness.

During the first course, Foundations in HSEP, students will learn an overview of the subjects including homeland security and emergency preparedness agencies, guidelines and concepts, according to program literature.

The students will research and create their own emergency action plans, Beaulieu said.

One of these plans would be figuring out the agencies or responders

that would help if there was a terrorist threat at a public location, she said.

After completing the foundational course, students have the opportunity of choosing from three different "strands" or paths: Homeland Security Sciences, Law Enforcement/Criminal Justice and Information/Communications Technology.

Each strand provides two more courses about the subject and the program concludes with an internship or "capstone project."

"A 'capstone project' is a project students can do at school if they are unable to find an internship focused on their interests," Beaulieu said. "It would be a research-based project and a professional [in that field] could work with the student or serve as a mentor."

She said the HSEP committee has coordinated with Harford Community College and the Community College of Baltimore County to make the Criminal Justice Track equal to a three-credit introductory criminal justice course at the colleges.

Beaulieu said that the program was the "brainchild" of Frank Mezzanotte, magnet programs coordinator of Harford County Public Schools.

She said that Mezzanotte was inspired by the opportunities APG has to offer, and that the project was four years in the making.

John Wallace, a science teacher at Edgewood High School, helped in the development of the curriculum.

Wallace, a former Navy commander, retired from APG's Chemical Biological Defense Command (now the Edgewood Chemical Biological Center) as a command naval liaison.

Wallace said he decided to get involved in the program because of his bio chemical warfare background, and because when he served in the Navy he was trained in "disaster preparedness."

He said he believes in the program

and thinks it will be very beneficial to students.

"This is an excellent program to provide real world experience and prepare high school students for graduation," Wallace said.

He said after taking the course, the students will be able to contribute to the community in a positive way.

Eileen Campbell, APG Child & Youth Services school liaison officer and one of the organizers for the school partnership meeting said that Mary Doak, community and educational outreach program manager for ECBC, served as a member on the program advisory committee since May 2005.

"Although unable to attend the meeting, she was pleased to have participated in the development of the curriculum," Campbell said.

Towery expressed interest in getting involved after hearing about the HSEP program.

"I believe that military and the

civilians that work on APG have a lot to offer this exciting program!" Towery said. "We have subject matter experts on Explosive ordnance disposal, security operations both physical and intelligence and incident management and response."

"We have the ability to coordinate training demonstrations or actual classes on EOD forensics and the process for obtaining security clearances," Towery said. "We believe that we could help coordinate and facilitate just about anything that the program would need from the Department of Defense. We are committed to seeing this program excel."

Magnet programs

Mezzanotte informed the leaders about the purpose of magnet programs offered at Harford County high schools.

"A magnet program is a high school program with a specialized curriculum that is offered at one site," he said.

Mezzanotte said that students can apply for the program while they are in eighth grade.

He said transportation is provided to students who don't attend the high school so they can participate in a magnet program.

Harford County offers the program because school officials "want kids to have a smooth transition from high school to college," he said. "We want them to have authentic learning where they are doing something hands on rather than just reading from a textbook."

Campbell said that she was pleased with the outcome of the meeting.

"My goal for this partnership meeting was to provide an awareness of what HCPS magnet programs have to offer our military Families," she said. "Colonel Towery's interest in suggesting assistance with the HSEP program indicates our HCPS/APG partnership's effectiveness."

Counselors say Transition Counselors Institute is godsend for them

"We try to use our little bit of power for the benefit of the children," high school guidance director Betty J. Thomas-McBride recently told more than 50 counselors and trainers at the Transition Counselors Institute training session in San Antonio, Texas.

This was Thomas-McBride's second year at the TCI training session, which is sponsored by the Military Child Education Coalition of Harker Heights, Texas. When she returned to Spencer High School, in Columbus, Ga., from last year's training session and conference, she told her counterparts about what she'd learned and emphasized that MCEC programs had top military official endorsement.

Bringing MCEC's efforts to help military-connected children and their Families to the forefront resulted in several policy changes at Spencer and surrounding schools that benefited transitioning military-connected students, Thomas-McBride said.

Before the changes, based on MCEC recommendations, military-connected students had to attend night school when they didn't have enough credits to meet graduation requirements, the counselor pointed out.

"Not in a one-year period, but in a two-year period," she said. "We discussed the issue and decided that we didn't have to send them to night school. We required eight credits, but if they only needed six credits for a full year where they came from, we accepted their six credits as a full year. Why penalize them for two credits if all they needed were six credits where they came from?"

"We were able to get that incorporated into our system just by talking to people," Thomas-McBride said. "So now if they come in with six credits, that's all they have to have. But if they start with us, they have to have eight credits."

She said the decision ended grueling days for some of the students.

"It's difficult to come to school from 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. then go to night school from 5:30 to 10:30 p.m. and then start all over again the next day," she said.

Calling the institute and MCEC wonderful things, Thomas-McBride said, "what's sweet about it is that the system embraced the recommendations and sent out a course-requirements-for-graduation document endorsing it. All counselors go by the document when we evaluate a four-year plan for every student. It shows that if a student wasn't here to earn eight credits and he earned six or seven in another school system, that's his graduation requirement."

Jimmi Graham, another counselor at Spencer, said, "I think that bringing counselors, administrators and advocates of children together is a great idea. To be able to focus on the transitioning issues that the students and parents have has actually helped us in our school system. With the sharing I've heard inside the meeting, it sounds like a lot of other people have been helped by that sharing also."

This was also Felicia Van Heertum's second MCEC conference and transition counselors training conclave. Noting that last year was her first experience working with military children and their emotional needs, she said it was a great learning experience for her.

"It helps me learn how to really help the parents be advocates for their children," said Heertum, a counselor at Antilles High School in Puerto Rico, which serves many students at Fort Buchanan. "We had parents come in, and Mary Keller, MCEC's executive director, came to Puerto Rico to conduct training as to how parents can prepare their own child's portfolio."

As an example, Heertum said a student who was going into her senior year transferred to Antilles from a school in Oklahoma. The Oklahoma school required 24 credits for graduation,

but she needed 26 at Antilles.

A former special education coordinator for disabled students, Heertum said, "The parent called me and asked, 'What can I do?' Well, because I'd just been to the MCEC conference, I realized that we could help. We wanted to make sure the child graduated on time without being penalized. It was very important for the parent that that student not have to attend classes with younger students, like sophomores. So we had the father and student meet with the counselor and they worked out activities that she could do so she could graduate with her peers."

"That was a great experience," she added. "All states require different graduation requirements and we shouldn't penalize students because their fathers transferred to Puerto Rico."

Families have to be advocates for their children because that's the best way to get things done.

"If teachers don't communicate with the parents, the parents should be the advocates and tell the teachers what they need from them," Heertum said. "That's because one teacher may be involved with one-hundred students and doesn't have time to contact all the parents."

DeAnn Howard of Mountain Home Junior High School at Mountain Home Air Force Base, Idaho, said attending MCEC conferences helps her to help students at her school.

"Just the awareness of what military Families go through is helpful," she said. "We try to make transition easier and getting ideas from the other counselors, which we incorporated in our school. That really helps."

"It's contagious to be able to share our ideas. It's energizing to meet together and realize what we're doing in education," Howard said. "We've also shared some of these ideas with our district counseling staff and have met with the district superintendent and high school principal."

Mary Rue started attending MCEC conferences before the institute was formed three years ago.

"My husband is retired Air Force, so I'm familiar with the transitioning problem," Rue said. "The networking is very important. When we can't find the history we need for students, I've been able to go to people I've met here, e-mail them, and get credits I need and find out what the description of a course is in a timely manner. It helps the children get situated so they feel better about the school."

Rue is a counselor at Virginia Stacey High School on Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, which runs junior high through high school with about 300 military-connected students.

Counselors are always busy because up to 60 percent of the student body turns over every year, Rue noted. Stacey's a small school, so some students can't get all the courses they want. Some may lose credit because courses like algebra may run two years where they were but only one year at Stacey.

Rue remembers the problems when she and her husband, retired Air Force Chief Master Sgt. Wesley Rue, came home from Germany.

"We went to Germany when my younger daughter was in the third grade and my older daughter was in the ninth grade," she said. "We came back and she was one of those students who had to leave during her senior year. So we had to figure out whether to buy a class ring from Germany or wait until we got to the place she was going to graduate from."

Working in a school district where more than 40 percent of the students are children of active duty and retired military personnel or their parents work on military installations, Marguerite Mitchell said the Transition Counselors Institute and Military Child Education coalition are godsend.

"This institute has made me aware firsthand of how important this is," said Mitchell, wife of James Mitchell, deputy chairman of the MCEC board of directors. "Also, some of the things I've been able to take back to my district

Transition Counselor Institute planned for APG in October

Aberdeen Proving Ground Child and Youth Services together with the Military Child Education Coalition will sponsor a Transition Counselor Institute for secondary and elementary school guidance counselors Oct. 4 and 5 at Top of the Bay.

The institute is in its seventh year. The first TCI was held in San Diego in July 2000. The institute is held in three phases.

Although Aberdeen Proving Ground held TCI in 2005, Harford County Public Schools Supervisor of School Counselors Cydney Wentzel and CYS School Liaison Officer, Eileen Campbell, agree that a repeat session is needed due to personnel requirements and time lapse.

"School counselors will better understand the needs for promoting smooth transitions and improve the predictability for their military and military-connected students," Campbell said.

"In fact, it is a readiness and retention issue for our military," said Cathy Franks, former high school teacher and TCI trainer from MCEC. "If the Family is happy and having good experiences, we're more likely to keep that well-trained individual in the military rather than having them leave the military when their time of service is up. We're a traveling institute. Just as our military-connected children are mobile, we're also mobile."

Franks said the institute makes a difference for military students, their parents and their schools.

"Part of the institute is simply bring-

ing counselors together from all over the world," she said. "Having them all together in the same room helps them learn from each other. They share ideas, and that's an important part of the institute."

Harford County Public School counselors presented an idea at a previous institute that led to the production of an MCEC poster with the graphics of silhouetted active teens and the label: "PCS- Positive Change of School" was their [civilian] interpretation of a much-used Army acronym.

MCEC developed a curriculum addressing the needs of the transitioning students, Franks noted.

"We want to meet the needs of the counselors so the counselors will meet the needs of the students," she said. "We're training the counselors because the counselors are very often the first person that's there to help the military-connected child as they move from place to place."

Attendees will include counselors from Harford County Public Secondary schools, nine Harford County Non-Public Elementary/Secondary schools and 14 Cecil County Public schools.

"The latter are new to the TCI's and it is hoped that CYS will build stronger partnerships with these schools through opportunities such as this," Campbell said.

are orientation programs. We know that's a real big issue.

"We have a three-day orientation program for new students each year. We also have an

orientation program for upper classmen at the beginning of the year to introduce them to the high school. We pair them up with buddies to assist them in their classes and in the cafeteria so they're not sitting all alone," she said.

The main thing transitioning children want to do is to make friends, said Mitchell, a counselor at Robert E. Fitch Senior High School in Groton, Conn.

"They want friends, peers, to be accepted and feel like they're part of the community," she said. "So the sooner we can get them acclimated to the school and connect them with kids with like issues or like interests, the better the transition for them will be."

Before the institute was created, "we tried to do it, but we didn't focus on it as much and didn't do a good job," Mitchell said. "So you want to improve on what you're doing. Periodically, we host a breakfast prepared by the cafeteria for

incoming new students and the principal comes to welcome them to the school. Meeting the principal makes them feel good and feel like they're welcome and he wants them to be there."

She said the staff sees the effect transitioning and mobility can have on children.

"This institute is definitely important in terms of having high school guidance counselors network about concerns involved with transitioning high school kids," she said. "They're looking at moving beyond high school into the real world and if we don't get them ready for that, we're doing a disservice to those kids."

"So this institute has made tremendous strides in trying to get us guidance counselors to understand the special needs of these kids," Mitchell said. "And the particular needs of all kids who are transitioning because we also have kids whose parents are not military-connected who also are mobile."



Preventing obesity in children

Childhood obesity is an ever-worsening problem in this country and is associated with serious and potentially life-threatening complications such as cardiovascular and kidney disease, high blood pressure and diabetes.

Many health care professionals use the term “epidemic” in discussing obesity in the pediatric population. In fact, the incidence of type II diabetes, a condition traditionally associated with middle aged or older adults and previously rare in children, is being recognized now in overweight adolescents.

This past June, an expert committee of medical and nursing organizations issued recommendations to health care providers concerning the assessment and management of childhood obesity. This statement included guidelines regarding screening of height

and weight, use of the Body Mass Index and evaluation of nutrition and activity levels in pediatric patients.

Children who eat most of their meals at home, avoid excessive consumption of sweetened drinks and eat age-appropriate portions are less likely to become overweight than those who do the opposite, according to the American Academy of Pediatrics.

A child’s activity level is also important in maintaining a healthy weight. Sixty minutes of moderate physical activity per day is recommended by the AAP. A total of less than two hours daily of TV/video watching, computer use and video game playing is also recommended.

All pediatric experts emphasize that televisions should not be present in children’s bedrooms.

In general, children should be encouraged to eat breakfast daily and not skip this impor-

tant meal. Meals outside the home, especially at fast food restaurants, should be limited, and ideally, dinner prepared and served at home six nights per week is helpful in supplying a balanced diet.

Meal time can be a wonderful opportunity for parents to model good nutrition and eating habits, as well as a time for socialization and Family bonding states the academy.

Children should not be forced to eat or to finish their plate, but rather permitted to recognize and develop a sense of fullness to prevent overeating.

Fruit juice should be limited to 4 to 8 ounces per day and milk to 16 to 24 ounces. Sodas, Kool Aid and other such drinks should be replaced with plenty of water.

A healthy diet should contain natural sources of fiber and calcium, limited fats, limited sweets and plenty of fruits and vegetables. Calorie intake

should be appropriate to age and gender.

The academy urges parents and children to visit www.mypyramid.gov to review food pyramid guidelines. Other helpful Web sites include www.aap.org for nutrition guidelines and obesity prevention recommendations for various age groups.

As always, pediatric primary care providers are available to address the topic of childhood obesity with their patients.

Planning healthy back-to-school snacks

Oh, the power of those supposedly “collectable” toys included for “free” in fast-food meals. It seems like those much-desired toys always end up on the floor of the Family mini-van or between the Family room sofa cushions. Now that school is starting again, it’s time to plan for and provide healthy snacks to children, so that harried parents will not feel tempted to run to the fast-food drive-through for quick, high-calorie, low-nutrient snacks. Before giving into cries for fast foods, consider the facts.

For the first time in history, this generation of children may live a shorter life span than their parents because of complications associated with overweight and obesity. The number of overweight children and adolescents ages 6 to 10 has tripled in the past 40 years.

- More than 10 percent of children between the ages of 2 and 5 are overweight, up from 7 percent in 1994.

- Overweight adolescents have a 70 percent chance of becoming overweight or obese adults.

- Rising levels of overweight and obesity are already taking their toll on children’s health. Type II diabetes, or

what used to be called “adult-onset diabetes,” is on the rise in children.

- Being overweight as a child predisposes children to other diseases—like hypertension and heart disease earlier in life. It may be associated with the rise in childhood asthma. Also, the emotional pain and scarring caused by being overweight as a child cannot be underestimated.

The Food and Drug Administration defines a healthy food as one that is low in fat. It must have less than 3 grams of fat per serving and less than 1 gram of saturated fat per serving. It must have a limited amount of cholesterol, not more than 60 milligrams per serving, and low sodium, not more than 360 milligrams per serving for individual foods and 480 milligram per serving for meal-type products. Additionally, an individual food item must provide at least 10 percent of one or more of vitamins A or C, iron, calcium, protein or fiber.

These are some strategies for planning healthy snacks:

- Limit fast foods as an option or limit a child’s choices to the healthier foods available (without the toy) like yogurt, salads or fruit.

- Snack on nutrient-rich fruits and vegetables.

- Limit high-calorie beverages like soda and juice. Switch to more nutritious items like low-fat milk. Low-calorie, flavored water is also available in pouches that are popular with children.

- Choose cheeses made from skim milk, as well as yogurt, dried apricots, seeds, whole unrefined grains and green leafy vegetables to meet a child’s daily dietary needs for magnesium.

The cost of those fast-food restaurant toys is astronomical when considering the health effects of all the fat and calories that come with it. If those toys are a must, they can be purchased for a collection with an unrelated, healthier food item or without any food at all.

'Take a stand. Lend a hand. Stop bullying now'

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Human Resources and Services Administration wants parents and students to learn more about bullying, its signs and effects in order to identify and end the practice.

Unfortunately, not everyone takes bullying seriously, including adults. This is why the HHS and the Maternal and Child Health Bureau developed the "Take a stand. Lend a hand. Stop bullying now!" campaign.

What is bullying?

A lot of young people already know what bullying is because they see it every day. Bullying happens when someone hurts or scares another person on purpose and the person being bullied has a hard time defending himself or herself. Usually bullying happens repeatedly. It can include:

- Punching, shoving or other acts that hurt people physically
- Spreading bad rumors

about people

- Keeping certain people out of a "group"
- Teasing people in a mean way
- Persuading certain people to "gang up" on others

Bullying also can happen online or electronically. Cyber bullying is when children or teens bully each other using the Internet, mobile phones or other cyber technology. This can include:

- Sending mean text, e-mail or instant messages
- Posting nasty pictures or messages about others in Blogs or on Web sites
- Using someone else's user name to spread rumors or lies about someone

Effects of bullying

There are many ways that young people bully each other, even if they don't realize it at the time. The sad facts are that bullying:

- Happens a lot more often than people think. Studies show that between 15 to 25 percent of U.S. students are bullied with some frequency.
- Can mess up a child's future. Young people who bully

are more likely than others who don't bully to skip school and drop out. They are also more likely to smoke, drink alcohol and get into fights.

• Scares some people so much that they skip school. As many as 160,000 students may stay home on any given day because they're afraid of being bullied.

• Can lead to huge problems later in life. Children who bully are more likely to get into fights, vandalize property and drop out of school. Sixty percent of boys who were bullies in middle school had at least one criminal conviction by age 24.

How children can help

When asked, "What threatens your safety and emotional health?" most children or teens say teasing and bullying, according to Kaiser, Family Foundation & Children Now, 2001). Yet, many adults, even parents and teachers, may not realize how often bullying occurs at school and elsewhere.

Children bullied day after day can feel helpless and alone. They may become too afraid

to report the bullying, fearing adults won't believe them and they worry that "tattling" will only make the bullying worse.

To protect children from being bullied, parents must first understand what bullying is, the harm it can do and the best ways to stop bullying behavior.

• Talk to adults about bullying. Discuss where the bullying takes place, who does the bullying and when it happens.

• Find out how bullying is handled at school. If you haven't been bullied but are close to someone who has and is willing to discuss it, talk to him or her about what could have been done differently. Did they tell a parent or teacher? Did an adult stop the bullying? Did any students help? What would make them feel safer?

• Be a leader to help stop bullying. Volunteer to help develop a bullying prevention program and Stop Bullying Now campaign.



If you checked any of these boxes, you are not alone. Young people all over the country have bullied others at one time or another. Bullying is serious business. It causes a lot of pain and it can affect the ability to do well in school, in personal and social interactions and in life in general. Take a stand. Lend a hand. Stop bullying now.

'Rainbow of Hope' reaches out to children living in homes with substance abuse

Father Martin's ASHLEY, a non-profit treatment center for alcoholism and chemical dependency in Havre de Grace, offers a children's program, "Rainbow of Hope," to the community each month.

"Rainbow of Hope" is for children ages 7 through 12 who are living or have lived in a home where alcoholism or drug addiction is/was present.

Donna Chappell, administrator of Family Services, said the mission of "Rainbow of Hope" is to help the children understand it is not their fault, and they are not alone."

"The program helps empower children to make the right choices and know it is okay to take care of themselves," Chappell said.

Children have the opportunity to talk to each other and share their experiences and feelings, Chappell said.

"They leave feeling better about themselves," she said. "It is a big step for them."

Through a puppet show, art, games and other fun activities, children learn about the disease of addiction and how to express and cope with many of their feelings. Each program is limited to 12 children. After the puppet show and discussion, they are divided into two age groups – 7 to 9 and 10 to 12, making the learning and exercise more age appropriate.

Ages 7 through 9 work with puppets on feelings, art projects and identifying who are safe people. Both groups work on affirmations about themselves and identifying their special qualities.

Ages 10 through 12 work on difficult situations and consider ways they can take care of themselves. The children are given healthy ways to identify and express anger. They watch videos, have discussions, write letters and share feelings and experiences, Chappell said.

She said the children have pizza and sandwiches for lunch and popcorn and snacks on breaks.

The day is focused on learning and sharing while having a "fun day," Chappell said.

The groups are facilitated by certified counselors and teachers who have in-depth knowledge of addiction and recovery.

The program is scheduled on the second Saturday of the month from 8:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Lunch and snacks are provided for the children.

Concurrent with the children's program, there is a parents/caregivers group which focuses on communication skills, rebuilding trust and the importance of affirmations in the life of a child.

The fee for one child is \$75, two children \$100 and three or more (same Family) \$125. Scholarship requests will be considered.

them frequently, and consider them important to morale, retention and readiness.

For years, however, program managers, policy makers and researchers have been confronted by the challenge of demonstrating a scientific, empirical link in what may be intuitively obvious.

Study findings will be integrated into recreation and Family program resource and marketing decisions and will play an important role in designing future research to assess the impact of these programs over time. The study also will contribute to a holistic assessment of how Army programs and benefits available to active and reserve components contribute to readiness and retention.

"MWR programs pro-

vide the safety net of social, emotional and psychological support that becomes like an extended family," Dannenfels-er said. "Soldiers who know

they can depend on MWR to help their Families are going to have the peace of mind to meet the challenges of today's Army."

Commentary: Navigating the 'Special Education' maze, gain understanding

Parents have often been confused, frustrated and generally perplexed in their attempts to understand how school officials make decisions about the education of their children who have special education needs.

Parents, talk with your child's teachers, administrators and counselors. Find out more about the evaluation and eligibility procedures for Individual Education Plans, Section 504 plans, grievance and due process hearings.

Parents often feel that the schools have built a complex special education maze through which only educators can find the way, but this is simply not the case.

One of the basic principles of the Individuals with Disability Education Act is that procedural safeguards must be in place to ensure that the

rights of children and their parents are protected and that there are clear steps to follow in case there is a dispute.

Contact your schools; ask for copies of these policies and procedures take a well-read copy with you to your meetings. This will signal to the school that you are serious about your child's education, and you know the rules.

At Army Community Service you will find information and workshops about these topics and more. Simply contact me, your Exceptional Family Member Program Manager, and I'll provide you with a copy of "Special Education Rights...And Wrongs" from the Maryland Disability Law Center. Understanding the difference between natural, artificial highs

Teaching children about substance abuse and explaining why some people abuse drugs and alcohol and why they shouldn't, can be very daunting.

The Aberdeen Proving Ground Army Substance Abuse Program has the answers.

Jareta Coyle, the APG Alcohol and Drug Control Officer, offers some suggestions to help parents share their Family values regarding substance abuse with their children.

She emphasizes the importance of parents communicating those values because "we know children learn their moralistic values in their family setting."

"They naturally want to be like their parents," Coyle said. "If you don't have those kinds of conversations with your children, someone else will."

Start by asking children why they crave their favorite foods.

"Point out that our brains reward us when we do something the brain likes," Coyle said. "This can be eating a good meal, riding a roller coaster, satisfying our thirst, getting hugs and kisses, hitting a home run, getting our hair brushed or our back tickled."

The brain processes positive stimuli and the chemical dopamine is released very deep in the brain, in the nucleus accumbens, which plays an important role in reward, pleasure and addiction.

"In other words, when you do something positive, your brain says 'nice job!' by releasing a chemical which makes you feel good. The more dopamine released, the better we feel," she said. "When the brain rewards us in this way for certain behavior, we naturally want to repeat the behavior."

However, humans have discovered shortcuts to get the brain rewards without having to do the work. These are the artificial rewards created by

drugs and alcohol.

"It doesn't seem to matter which we abuse, our brain is tricked into releasing dopamine to make us feel good," Coyle said.

Drugs and alcohol also have a bigger kick than eating a good meal or drinking water. So some people become dependent on an artificial substance to feel good.

Often people who are in pain emotionally or physically look to chemicals to alleviate their discomfort instead of getting help for their problems. They could be experiencing loneliness, boredom, anxiety, shyness, depression, or any number of emotional states or physical pain. For them, the attraction of drugs and alcohol is the escape from these feelings which often leads to addiction as they repeat the behavior to get the brain's reward.

After a while, the brain changes physically due to the developing addiction and they need the alcohol or drug just to feel normal. At this point, they begin to use them just to avoid the unpleasant feelings they get when they quit using the chemical which has altered their brain.

"Those of us who have learned how to have fun, how to feel good, we have done so probably through trial and error," Coyle said. "It takes a little more practice sometimes, a little more skill, but it can be done."

"Having a hobby about which we are passionate; helping others to learn new skills or feel good about themselves; getting our thrills from sports; learning social skills which enable us to overcome our social shyness; falling in love: these are just a few of the many ways we get our rewards from within rather than seeking chemicals from without to make us feel good."

"Once you learn what makes you feel good, you will probably practice feeling good

often. It becomes something you can control, unlike drugs and alcohol which come to control you," Coyle said.

There are no unpredictable side effects to natural highs, no risk, no guilt, no toxicity, no loss. The individual, not the drug, is in control.

"But what if you, as the parent, has the occasional alcoholic beverage? How do you impart to your children your concerns about their use of alcohol before they are grown," Coyle asked. "What if you come from a culture where small amounts of adult beverages are shared with children on special occasions?"

Coyle suggests parents keep in mind that their children are going to be influenced more by parental behavior than by words.

"If they see you using alcohol to deal with stressful situations, for instance, they'll come to associate chemicals with solutions to problems," Coyle said. "If they see you practicing appropriate coping skills minus the chemicals, they too will learn from that."

The emphasis should be that these are adult beverages which adult bodies can handle, but growing bodies can't, Coyle said.

More and more evidence is linking early drinking to risk for alcohol dependence.

According to the July 2006 issue of the Archives of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine, 47 percent of those who began drinking at a young age (younger than age 14) experienced alcohol dependence during their lifetimes, compared with nine percent of those who began drinking at age 21 or older. Young bodies simply are not equipped to metabolize what is ultimately a toxic substance when consumed in quantity. The risk is there regardless of sex, race, educational level, family status, socioeconomic level, antisocial behavior history and smoking patterns.

Parents who can delay the onset of their children's drinking are in effect inoculating them against the disease we call alcoholism.

In Cecil County, West Nottingham Academy offers the Chesapeake Learning Center program for children with similar issues. West Nottingham accepts both day school and boarding school students.

Youth centers offer relief for parents

The three words, "back to school," can be the cause of anxiety and excitement for children and parents alike. There are back-to-school sales for everything from clothing to school supplies, taking last-minute vacations, and then there's the task of making arrangements for care for children and youths.

Aberdeen Proving Ground Youth Service centers (one in Aberdeen and another in Edgewood) can relieve this problem for parents, offering a worry-free place for school-age, middle and high school children.

Both centers meet Department of Defense and Department of the Army standards to conduct school-age programs. This certification is APG's "license to operate" and is considered to be the equivalent of state licensing.

There are options and services available in all CYS programs for school age

children, middle school youths and teens. Partnerships exist with schools and MWR activities and include affiliate membership in Boys & Girls Club of America and active 4-H Clubs. The Baseline Programs are Technology Lab(s), Homework Center(s), a Youth Council, Youth Sponsorship, Games and Leisure Activities, Volunteer Community Service Opportunities, Workforce Preparation, Individual/Group Sports & Fitness Activities, Affiliate memberships in Boys & Girls Club of America and active 4-H Clubs.

"If all of this sounds like a place you want your school-age, middle school and high school children to spend their time, the first step is to determine what you're looking for in terms of child care and recreational activities," Warwick said. "APG's Youth Services offers Before and After School Programs, Open Recreation Programs and are the host locations for several sports and instructional programs." **APG North Youth Services-building 2522, off Bayside Drive**

This facility boasts several activity rooms, including an art room, game rooms, middle school room, teen lounge, dance room, snack bar, technology lab, homework center, gymnasium and two outdoor patios.

"Both Youth Center programs offer club activities as well," said Renee Main, SAS site supervisor in APG North. "D.A.R.E., Ultimate Journey, S.M.A.R.T. Girls, photography, cooking club and various tech

clubs are offered to youths ages 6 to 12. The tech club, photography club, cooking club and others are offered to the middle school and teen groups. These clubs among others help foster leadership opportunities and life skills."

Homeschooled children and youths on Aberdeen Proving Ground meet for group learning sessions 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Wednesday at the APG North Youth Center.

On occasion, the group meets at the APG South Youth Center for computer training, said Eileen Campbell, APG school liaison officer.

The students showcase their best works with an annual Art Show at the Youth Center.

Classes resume for the 2007-2008 school year Sept. 19.



Unfortunately, our children are exposed to so many kids who continuously view games, movies and music that would make an adult blush. Please, do not misunderstand; we are not

advocating homeschool for the "sheltering" aspect. On the contrary, homeschooled children, if properly guided, have plenty of opportunities for peer interactions through city sports, co-ops*, umbrella groups*, church, scout groups and more. That leaves plenty of birthday parties, outings and sleepovers with friends to fill a calendar year with no problem.

Another benefit of homeschooling is having a relationship with the friends your children spend time with. As a homeschooler, you simply have the ability to know what your children are exposed to for just a bit longer as their attitudes and understanding of the world develops.

The second subject of concern is the academic aspect of teaching at home.

Before my [Laura Allen] final decision to homeschool, I made a phone call. Since we are a military Family, there is a chance that one of our children might decide to choose the military as a career. With that in mind, I called the mother (or father) of all schools, the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. I asked the officer

who answered the phone if they accept homeschooled children.

To my very pleasant surprise, he informed me, most assuredly, that they accept homeschooled children every year.

He offered a few tips to make sure they qualify when the time is right. He said that every homeschooler that

applies has no problem qualifying academically; they are usually at the top of the charts. He also told me to keep them in sports, scouts and church and they should be fine. What a relief! If West Point considers homeschooled children an asset, there might be something to it.

Do not be afraid of teaching your children, by the way. The books are scripted and lesson plans are drawn out for you, if you wish.

Keep in mind that APG has a homeschool co-op* where we help each other teach and guide the children in various subjects. You are not alone.

For the final and most important facet of homeschooling we really need to be focusing on our own needs for a moment. Just put aside socialization and academics.

We want to talk about the sensitive nerves and short fuse that most of us acquire, miraculously, upon our child's birth. It wasn't there before, so where did it come from? Let's talk about a parents' ability to spend 24 hours a day with their children. No more coffee and cheesecake outings with the friends and no more grocery shopping alone.

These are very valid concerns and they are in our opinion, one of the biggest obstacles to overcome. You must wake up one day and make a decision, the hardest decision of your life. You have to decide if you are willing to sacrifice your own comfort for the well being of your little ones.

Again, please understand, we completely believe that private and public schools can be a wonderful place for a child to develop as long as the parents are involved. However, if you have a place in your heart where you know homeschooling has always been tugging at, then you must be willing to give up a few pleasures of your own.

What you get in place of time alone is the benefit of knowing your children, not just knowing about them. It is amazing what you learn about them when you slow the fast paced life and enjoy time with your kids. This is important

whether you homeschool or not. You get to watch all of their light bulb moments as they begin to grasp a subject. You get the peace of mind that you know who is influencing your child, and most of all, you get off season rates when you go on vacation. Did we say that out loud?

Seriously, know there is a huge support system out there. You are not alone and if you are the Family member or friend of a homeschooler, remember, the only reason it seems strange is because it is still a mystery to you. Ask questions and take the mystery out of it.

Also, the co-op provides additional learning for children in addition to their current curriculum such as Bob Jones, Abeka, or other curriculums.

Either way the time spent at a co-op should be structured, fun and stress free for both child and parent.

The LIONS Co-op also provides a time for students to interact with each other. Whether it is in a class, the gym, or sitting around having lunch together they get to connect with someone other than the teacher in their lives. Most parents bring sack lunches and enjoy a time of fellowship and networking with other parents as well.

The co-op is all about a partnership between

parents, each taking turns teaching classes or helping out in areas that they feel comfortable in. The different skills and talents we can offer to others is what makes the program so successful.

Whether it is teaching children to play chess or teaching them to read sheet music, that commitment can go a long way.

Seeking help when necessary is a sign of Soldier's strength

Imagine the scenario below. Do the issues sound familiar? They should, because they are based on common experiences that real, deployed Soldiers have faced.

Sgt. Jones was two weeks into his leave. It was just two weeks ago that he returned from his first deployment in Iraq. He was still hyped up from an argument with his wife about their finances when he left the house to have a couple of beers at the local bar. He thought the beers would calm his nerves.

It turned out that he had more than a couple of beers. As he was leaving the bar, he caught a glimpse of his car being towed away for illegal parking. He went to the police department and demanded that his car be returned to him immediately. The desk sergeant realized that Jones was drunk and offered to call his first sergeant to pick him up. Jones was told he could retrieve his car in the morning.

Jones became angry and told the desk sergeant, "If you don't return my car to me, I will blow this ----- place up."

The desk sergeant had had enough. He locked Jones up in a cell. However, Jones was allowed to call his first sergeant.

By the time the first sergeant arrived, Jones was somewhat sober. The first sergeant asked him what was going on. Jones explained the sequence of events. The first sergeant told Jones that he was home now,

and he could not be threatening to blow up people, let alone be drunk and misbehaving.

"Jones, you are one of my best NCOs, why are you messing up?" the First Sergeant said.

"I can't explain," Jones said. "You'll know I'm a wimp. I could lose my career."

The First Sergeant laid his hand on Jones's shoulder.

"Unless we stop what's going on right now and fix what's troubling you, you're going to lose your career anyway," he said. "We still have a chance to fix things, you and me. We still have control of your career. Now tell me what's going on."

Jones explained that since returning home, he's felt tense and restless. He doesn't sleep well, and when he does sleep, he wakes up in the middle of the night because of nightmares. He feels very uncomfortable around friends and relatives.

"They don't understand what I've been through for the past year," Jones said. "My wife and I are arguing about everything."

The First Sergeant assured Jones that he understood, and that he once felt that way after a deployment. He explained that it wasn't unusual to have these kinds of experiences after returning home from war. He also told his Soldier that these experiences shouldn't be ignored.

The First Sergeant also told Jones that he thought he needed help to get his life and career back on track, from those who "get it." He explained that there are people at behavioral health who understand and can help Soldiers recover from the

experiences of war.

Jones was hesitant but First Sergeant assured him that unless he stopped what had been going on, he would jeopardize his career in the Army and possibly face a lifetime of problems.

"Jones it's still in your control," he urged.

The next day, Jones reported to the First Sergeant's office. The First Sergeant had already taken him off leave and set up an appointment with behavioral health.

After about a week, Jones saw his First Sergeant again. He asked him how he was doing, and Jones said he was sleeping much better and he did not feel as angry. He indicated that he was going to see the counselor for a few more sessions, and that the counselor helped him to better understand that he needed to readjust to returning home, and that adjustment required patience and time.

The First Sergeant informed Jones that their commander was delaying any disciplinary action pending improvement in his behavior: "If you get your act together, no action will be taken against you for last week's behavior."

It was very fortunate for Jones that he had a First Sergeant who understood the readjustment difficulties Soldiers experience after a combat deployment. Also, the first sergeant had quickly identified his Soldier's need for help, and he acted accordingly. He didn't perceive the process of getting help as a career-ender for his Soldier—he saw it as the way to save a good Soldier's career.

The First Sergeant maintained that Jones's career was always in their hands as long as Jones worked to resolve his problems.

The above situation is not always what happens when a Soldier begins to experience difficulties with making adjustment back home. Due to the stigma of seeking help, many Soldiers can let problems escalate out of control, resulting in long-term emotional problems and even immediate discharge from the military.

Stigma is widespread in the Army. Stigma leads Soldiers and leaders to avoid and often discriminate against fellow Soldiers who are experiencing personal, emotional problems. It leads to low self-esteem, isolation, and hopelessness the result for the Soldier who struggles with readjustment to home, which deters the Soldier from seeking care. Responding to stigma, Soldiers with mental health issues internalize others attitudes and become so embarrassed or ashamed that they often conceal symptoms and fail to seek treatment.

When Soldiers fail to seek appropriate help, the general outcome is emotional degeneration leading to poor work performance and even suicidal behavior. As more Soldiers seek help and share their stories with buddies, leaders and relatives, compassion will be the response, not ridicule. Soldiers and leaders must end this notion that seeking help is weak and damaging to the career. The truth is that seeking help when necessary is a sign of strength.

BUS ROUTE SCHEDULE



School bus schedules and routes for the 2007-08 school year for Harford County Public Schools have been released. School is scheduled to open for approximately 40,500 public school students Aug. 27. Approximately 35,000 students will be transported by school buses daily. The bus schedules are available on the Harford County Public School Web site www.hcps.org.

Since routes are based on estimated fall enrollments, school officials remind parents and students to expect minor adjustments in bus loads and schedules during the first week of school in order to alleviate any overcrowded buses.

Students attending Harford Technical High School, Daytime Alternative Education, Science/Math Academy at Aberdeen High School, Restoration Academy at the CEO Building, John Archer

School and any elementary preschool programs will be contacted by their bus driver, as will all other special needs students.

Bus routes are planned so that a maximum number of children are picked up and discharged at the nearest stop to their home. Generally, bus stops are located at least one-fourth mile apart. The bus drivers will inform the children of the designated stops during the first few days of school.

The a.m. time for each bus is the estimated time of the first stop the bus will make on its morning run. This time may vary several minutes during the first few days of school until each driver is able to establish a definitive schedule. Students should plan to be at the bus stop at least five minutes before the scheduled pickup time. Children who plan to use bus transportation

are encouraged to ride the bus beginning the first day of school to facilitate the establishment of the time schedule and the bus load.

The p.m. return time to home for each bus may be longer at the beginning of the school year to accommodate students adjusting to new school settings. Once the schedule has been established, there will be a normal drop-off time for each student.

The pupil transportation rules will be distributed to each pupil on the first day of school and discussed in class. Parents are urged to review the rules with their children.

High school students and parents are reminded that the starting time for high schools will begin 15 minutes earlier this year. High schools will begin classes at 7:30 a.m.

Back to school safety tips

The start of the 2007-2008 school year is quickly approaching. As students prepare to go back to school, the Installation Safety Division would like parents, teachers and students to remember to be safety conscious. Safety is everyone's responsibility.



School bus safety

Emergency exits

Always know where the exits are. In an emergency, listen to the driver for instructions.

Crossing control arm

The crossing control arm is mounted on the front bumper and will swing out when the bus door is opened. It is designed to keep children who are crossing the street from walking too close to the front of the bus.

Danger zone (front)

It is never safe to walk close to the front of the bus. The bus driver may be sitting too high to see you. Walk five giant steps ahead of the bus before crossing.

Danger zone (side)

Never walk close to the side of a bus. Stay at least five giant steps away from the side.

Danger zone (back)

Bus drivers cannot see what is behind the bus. Never walk behind a school bus.



Bus stop safety

Ensure there is a safe place away from traffic for children to wait for the bus. Check bus stop areas for hazards and report any safety issues to the APG police, 410-306-0565.

Instruct children to:

- Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop. Stand back from the curb and line up.
- Use the handrail while entering and exiting the bus.
- Sit down in a seat and refrain from distracting the driver.
- Always wait for the bus to stop before standing up.
- Be at the bus stop at least one minute before the bus arrives.
- Always take five big steps away from the bus after exiting so the driver can see you.
- Watch street traffic. Drivers are required to follow certain rules concerning stopped buses but not all do.
- Report any suspicious activity in the area and don't talk to strangers.
- Tell the bus driver, a teacher or a parent if someone is harassing you at the bus

stop or on the bus.

- Never accept a ride from a stranger.
- Never go after someone who has fallen and rolled under the bus. Tell the bus driver right away.



Backpack safety

To promote spinal health, here are some helpful tips on the safe use of a backpack.

Choose the right size. This is the most important step for safe use of a backpack. The backpack back length should match the carrier's. For best results, measure the carrier's back and then use a tape measure to measure the backpack before purchasing.

Pack correctly. The maximum weight of a loaded backpack should not exceed 15 percent of the body weight. Pack only what is needed to avoid overloading. If the carrier has to bend forward to walk the backpack is overloaded.

Lift correctly. Face the backpack. Bend at the knees and use both hands to check the weight of the pack. Straighten the legs while lifting. Apply one shoulder strap and then the other. Do not carry the backpack on one shoulder.

Wear correctly. Use both straps, snug, but not too tight. If the backpack has a waist strap, use it.

More safety tips

Walking to School

Even if children walk to school, they still have to protect themselves and be cautious of their surroundings. Because of minimal supervision, young pedestrians face a wide variety of dangers and must be prepared to make good decisions. Here are a few basic safety tips to share:

- Obey all traffic signals and/or the crossing guard - never cross the street against a light, even if there isn't any traffic coming.
- Walk with a buddy.
- Wear reflective or brightly colored material - it makes children more visible to street traffic.

Riding in a Car

Most traffic crashes occur close to home. Safety belts are the best form of protection passengers have in the event of a crash. Drivers and passengers wearing their seat belts properly lower their risk of injury by 45 percent. A person is four times more likely to be seriously injured or killed if ejected from a vehicle in a crash. Everyone needs to be buckled up properly. That means older children in seat belts, younger children in booster seats and little children in child safety seats.

Does your child ride in the back seat?

The back seat is generally the safest place in a crash. If the vehicle has a passenger air bag, it is essential for children 12 and under, as well as very small adults, to ride in back.

Facing the right way?

Infants should ride in rear facing restraints (in the back seat) until they reach age 1 and weigh at least 20-22 lbs. Infants who weigh 20 lbs. before age 1 should ride in a restraint approved for higher rear facing weights. Always read the child restraint manual for instructions on properly using the restraint. Children over 1 year weighing at least 20 lbs. may ride facing forward.

Does the safety belt hold the seat tightly in place?

Put the belt through the correct slots. If the safety seat can be used facing either way, use the correct belt path for each direction. Check the vehicle owner's manual and safety seat instruction book for guidance.

Is the harness buckled snugly around the child?

Keep harness straps snug over the child's shoulders. Place the chest clip at armpit level.
